Narrator	When Jesus Christ returns! In this life, we will one day die. But because of Jesus' resurrection, we are offered new life. And we can have HOPE and CONFIDENCE that death has been destroyed forever. Jesus is alive and our faith in him means we can be alive with him too!

Main point: Just as Christ was raised from the dead, our bodies will also be raised, as immortal, spiritual bodies. This has been made possible because of Jesus on the cross, and how he defeated not only sin but also death.

Warm-up Questions

- 1. What is the difference between an earthly body and a heavenly body?
- 2. Even if you are not sure how the resurrection of the dead will look like, what are some of the things you can be sure of?

Teaching time: **Key points that might be covered during this time.

Last week we looked at the story of Jesus' resurrection and how this is the basis of our faith as Christians. We looked at how we KNOW the resurrection is an historical event that DID happen and how because of this, we can be filled with confidence that Jesus has destroyed sin forever.

Today, we'll be looking a bit further into how one day, when Jesus returns, we will experience the resurrection ourselves. Because of Jesus' resurrection, we are assured that not only sin has been destroyed, but also death.

Now Paul spends the whole of Chapter 15 writing about Christ's resurrection and the resurrection of the dead, because some people in Corinth were teaching that there was no Resurrection. Clearly, Paul knew otherwise as he had seen the Resurrected Christ himself in his encounter on the road to Damascus.







Theme Focus

Resurrection of the Dead

Explanation of the God's Church Series

The Apostle Paul, who founded the Church in Corinth, was living in Ephesus when he heard reports of quarrelling within the Corinthian church. Upon discovering about their deep divisions, he writes to the Corinthian believers in order to give them much needed support and direction, providing them with a model for how the church should handle the problem of sin in a worshipping community. In Paul's letter, he addresses a number of issues related to life and doctrine, including: divisions and quarrels, sexual immorality, lawsuits among believers, relationship status, freedom in Christ, order in worship, the significance of the Lord's Supper, and the right use of spiritual gifts.

Main Point: Just as Christ was raised from the dead, our bodies will also be raised, as immortal, spiritual bodies. This has been made possible because of Jesus on the cross, and how he defeated not only sin but also death.

Discussion Questions

1. Have you ever had anything die before? A loved one, a pet, a plant?

Having things die can be very sad. When people or things die, it is ok to be upset. We miss them and want them back. We even want them to stay with us forever. The great news is, that when Jesus returns, we are promised that all those who trust in him WILL BE joined together and will live with him forever!

Read 1 Corinthians 15:35-58 from the Bible Story

- 2. (Hold up a seed). Do you think this seed is living or dead? Does it have life? (At the moment, it is lifeless. Technically seeds are in a dormant state, until the right factors are present, where they can sprout life again. In the meantime, they are waiting, lifeless).
- 3. When we die, our bodies are buried and have no life. But, when Jesus returns, what will happen to our bodies? (Our dead, lifeless bodies will be made new. They will be given life. We will be given heavenly bodies).
- 4. Besides resurrected bodies, what else can we look forward to when Jesus returns? (No sin, no pain, no sickness, no sadness).
- 5. How long will our new, resurrected bodies last? (Forever! Those who trust in Jesus have been promised eternal life with him, forever!).

Read 1 Corinthians 15:43-58 from the Bible Story

- 6. When Jesus died and rose again, what did he defeat? (Answer: b).
 - (a) winter
 - (b) sin and death
 - (c) zombies
 - (d) a world record
- 7. At the moment, we have a human body. When Jesus returns and we are raised, we will be given a spiritual body. What do you think this will be like? (We will be raised just like Jesus with a body that is recognisable yet unrecognisable. At the very least we will be able to recognise each other as who we are now, but there will also be something different about us. There is a certain degree of unknown and incomprehensibility about this for the very fact that it is unlike anything we may have experienced.)
- 8. What are you most looking forward to, with the resurrection of the dead?

Dear God, We thank you that we can look forward to being resurrected with you one day. Thank you that through Jesus' death and resurrection, we have hope and assurance of all that is to come - that death will be defeated once and for all. Amen.

Discussion Questions

1. What do you believe happens to us after we die?

Read 1 Corinthians 15:35-42 from the Bible Story

Today we read where Paul writes to the Corinthians to remind them that there is indeed a physical resurrection of the dead.

- 2. Why do you think the Corinthians needed reminding about the resurrection of the dead? What did they believe would happen when we die? (The Corinthians had some dodgy teaching happening around this topic. Some were teaching that there was no physical raising of the when when Jesus returns, but rather just a sort of spiritual afterlife).
- 3. When Jesus returns, what will happen to our bodies? (Our dead, lifeless bodies will be made new. They will be given life. We will be given heavenly bodies).
- 4. Besides resurrected bodies, what sort of things can we look forward to when Jesus returns? (No sin, no pain, no sickness, no sadness).
- 5. How long will our new, resurrected bodies last? (Forever! Those who trust in Jesus have been promised eternal life with him, forever!).

Read 1 Corinthians 15:43-58 from the Bible Story

- 6. When someone dies, it is a human body that is buried in the ground. But the body that God raises up is a spiritual body. What do you think the difference is between these? (We will be raised just like Jesus with a body that is recognisable yet unrecognisable. There is a certain degree of unknown and incomprehensibility about this for the very fact that it is unlike anything we may have experienced.)
- 7. How can we be assured of all that has been promised? How can we be confident that when Jesus will return he will conquer death once and for all? (Jesus' death on the cross has already conquered sin. His resurrection shows us that death has no power over him that he has the victory. When he returns, we shall share in that victory and death and be defeated, salvation completed.)

Dear God, We thank you that we can look forward to being resurrected with you one day. Thank you that through Jesus' death and resurrection, we have hope and assurance of all that is to come - that death will be defeated once and for all. Amen.

- 2. Have the children play with the dolls and their accessories.






Body Tracing

- 2. Let the child decorate and colour in their body picture. Encouraging them to add clothes, hair, shoes and other details.









- 3. Talk about Jesus dying on the cross and then rising to new life, defeating both sin and death.










Play Dough Mats - bodies and faces Play Dough Tables (x 3)

- 3. Help the children form to make bodies that match those on the play dough mat. If they are using the face mats, get them to add eyes, nose, mouth, hair, etc.








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
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







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


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
- 1. Each player is to receive a different game board.

- 4. Continue calling out the cards until someone has 5 pictures/counters in a row (could be horizontal, vertical, or diagonal). .













- 1. Pass out the books and get the children to skim through the pages that are bookmarked these sections all relate to revelation/new creation and the promises of our future in God's Kingdom.
- 2. Get them to share what each book shows (pictures) or describes what things are going to be like in new creation.
- 3. Invite discussion over the following:
 - · What are we told that things will look like?
 - What are we told will happen to our bodies?
 - What things will NOT be in new creation?
 - What things WILL be in new creation?
 - What else can you be sure of?

Ship to Shore

Link: Just as Christ was raised from the dead, our bodies will also be raised, as immortal, spiritual bodies. This has been made possible because of Jesus on the cross, and how he defeated not only sin but also death.

You will need:

· Big flat floor space with as many players as you want

Game Set Up:

Designate one side of the room to be **earth** (ship).
 The other side of the room is to be called **heaven** (shore).
 The centre line of the room (where children start) is to be called **new creation**.

Rules:

- 1. Have children start in the centre of the room.
- 2. Call out positions (earth, heaven, or new creation) and children are to run to the appropriate side of the room.
- 3. When you call out action commands, children are perform that action.
- 4. The aim is not to be the last person doing an action.

Actions - earth:


- 1. **Creation** children make the shape of a globe with their hands.
- 2. **Sin** children shake their finger as if to say 'naughty'.
- 3. **Fish** children move hands in front of them, like fish swimming.
- 4. **Dogs** children get down on all fours and pretend to be a dog.

Actions - heaven:

- 1. **Holy** lay one hand flat facing upwards. The other hand brushes across the hand and out, away from the body.
- 2. **Clouds** alternating hands, children make squeezy hand actions above their head, as if they were grabbing a cloud in the hand.
- 3. Angel children flap arms like wings

Actions - new creation:

- 1. **God** children point up to God.
- 2. **Perfect** 2 thumbs up
- 3. King Jesus two hands on heads, making a crown shape

Duster Hockey

Link: Just as Christ was raised from the dead, our bodies will also be raised, as immortal, spiritual bodies. This has been made possible because of Jesus on the cross, and how he defeated not only sin but also death.

You will need:

Children in pairs of approximately same age/size

- 1 small/medium ball
- 2 duster hockey sticks per team (rolled up newspaper style)

Preparation:

- * Have the children stand in 2 rows approximately 4m away from each other, facing inwards. If there are more than 30 children (2 rows of 15), begin a new set/group in a parallel part of the space.
- * The ball is to be placed in the centre of the teams.
- * A duster hockey stick is to be placed between 2 markers at the end of each rows, delineating the goal ends.

Instructions:

1. Each player is paired up with a person diagonally opposite to them. They are each given a word (normally a number). This is their code word. Whenever it is called out, they must run to their team's end to retrieve a duster hockey stick. And then they run to the centre, where the ball is, and they try and hit the ball down to their goal end.

2. Team code words:
