THIS WEEK'S FOCUS

In a world where people cared only for their own families, the first Christians became one big family that shared food, helped each other, and worshipped God together. They showed everyone that God's family is open to all who follow Jesus.

SERIES OVERVIEW

Strange Religion (Acts)

Whilst western Christianity can often look very similar to western culture, the very first followers of Jesus—along with their communities—were extraordinarily distinctive. Perhaps even a little weird! These new believers who were part of a new movement deviated from so many of the cultural norms and societal expectations. And in a culture in which everyone was 'religious', Christians still stood out as strange.

Yet whilst distinctive, these first Christians were also strangely compelling. As people witnessed their lives and heard their message, some were offended, others were confused, but many came to believe. In this eight-part series, we'll explore some of the earliest accounts of the church in Acts to see how the Gospel distinctively transformed these very first believers, also considering how the Gospel should continue to transform the lives of believers today.

TEACHING TIME

Belonged to a Household of Faith

Today we're learning about how the early Christians became a new community - not like any other community that they'd ever experienced before! They were like one big household filled with very different people - but all learning together.

No wonder the Christians seemed strange: in the community there were rich people and poor; educated people and not; people who were Jews and people from many different countries. They would have even spoken different languages. But together they were all following Jesus as King.

In this new community, they were learning together about what it meant to be God's family. And it was very different from anything they'd ever experienced.

Let's see how it was different. They shared everything! Imagine what that must have been like! Sharing the things you owned with people who had been strangers not long ago. How easy do you think that would be?

And they shared their time with each other too. It seems that they did just about everything together.

They would meet together to pray, to eat, to worship, to talk, to learn, and to live. Every day.

And why? Because they wanted to learn more about Jesus together. It was all so exciting to be part of God's family.

And they wanted to share the Gospel with others around them - even the people who thought that they were strange. They were not doing this alone because they had each other. And even more importantly, they had the Holy Spirit living in them so they could be brave enough to tell people around them.

Even though they were different from one another, they shared the same mission

Our church community might look a little different to this first church community. However, we have the same mission and purpose - to grow as disciples of Jesus and to introduce other people to Jesus too.

And like those early Christians, we continue to worship, pray, share, serve. and encourage each other in this mission.

Additional ideas: This activity can also be played as a MEMORY game or GO FISH.








Memory Discs

YOU'LL NEED...

 Printout of Worksheet #2 stuck onto round wooden discs (optional)

STEPS

- Show the children all of the different images on the discs talking through what they are and how they connect to today's story.
 Ensure they are familiar with each one.
- Place all of the discs face down on a flat surface in front of the group. It is best to lay them out in a grid format.
- 3. Taking turns, each person flips over 2 discs, revealing the images. If they match (identical), they keep those discs and have another turn. If they do not match, flip them back over and the next player has their turn.
- The aim is to remember where each of the images are located so that you might find as many pairs as possible on your turn.

YOU'LL NEED...

- Printout of Worksheet 4
- Clipboards
- Paper
- Pencils

STEPS

- Provide the children with a copy of the Word Cloud from Worksheet #4.
- 2. Explain that this word cloud has been produced using all the words from Acts 24-24 (NIRV version, as shown below). Explain that a word cloud words by counting the different words and enlarging the font based on the frequency of the words used l.e, together is the word that is used the most in this possage as it is shown as the biggest. The next group of frequently used words are shared, believers, amazed apostles etc.
- 3. Use this as a prompt for discussion:

a) What do you notice about how the early church lived their lives?

b) Are you surprised by anything in this word bubble? Explain.

c) What stands out to you as the most challenging feature of the how the early church lived?

d) How is this word bubble the same as how Christians live today? How is it different?

Have the children flip the page over and design a new word cloud based on what our church looks like now. I.e., what would be the largest words based on the actions of your own church? Would it be TOCETHER? Or LOVE? Or CARE? Other?

The believers studied what the apostles taught. They shared their lives together. They are and prayed together. Everyone was amazed at what Cod was doing. STEPS

- 1. Have the children sit in a circle together.
- Give one child the ball and play some music. When the music plays, the children must pass the ball around the circle. When the music stops, the last person to hold the ball must complete a task by selecting a card from the bucket.
- Once they have completed their challenge, they sit down and the music resumes and the ball gets passed around once more.


GAME: Matthew, Mark, Luke, John

YOU'LL NEED...

N/A

STEPS

- Sit everyone in a circle. Each seat is assigned a name or number, starting with Matthew, Mark, Luke, John, then numbering off in order (one, two, three, four, etc until everyone has a number).
- 'Matthew' starts everyone off with a clapping rhythm, which is done together: slapping knees then clapping hands, and repeat. Ensure you do this quite slowly (approximately 80bpm).
- Once the rhythm has been established, 'Matthew' begins by saying their name (Matthew) on the downbeat and then a different name or number on the next downbeat.. E.g. Matthew, (clap), 2 (clap).
- The person who is named (i.e., 2) must then call their own number on their first beat, followed by the name/number of another's position on their second. (E.g. 2, clap, 16, clap).
- If someone misses the rhythm, or fails to properly calls their own name or number, etc., they must move to the very last position in the circle. Then start the clapping rhythm again.
- 6. The objective of the game is to become 'Matthew', and stay in that position as long as possible. (A bit like handball - the desire is to become 'ace' or for the other players, the desire is to knock any of the Apostles out of their spots).





The Apostles were the primary and first disciples of Jesus. This began as the 12 disciples, but there became many more than can be counted.
