Discussion Questions

Main Point: Many people ignored the poor, but the first Christians shared what they had so no one would be in need. They showed that God's love means caring for the people others forget.

Warm-up questions

1. When was the last time you saw someone in need (at school? In your community? Elsewhere)?
2. What do you think the world thinks of generosity? It is something that is promoted and encouraged or not?

Read Acts 4:32-37

3. What does it mean to be "of one heart and mind"? (v.32)
4. How did the early Christians view their possessions? How is this different from how we typically view our belongings?
5. How did the early church display generosity? Which example from vs32-37 stands out to you the most?

6. How did the early church's generosity demonstrate the grace that had been given to them all? (V34-35).
7. Who was Barnabas and what did he do? (vs.36-37)
8. Do you think you would find it easy or hard to share in the way that the believers in the story did? Why or why not?
9. What does this passage teach us about the nature of Christian community?

Application

10. Can you name at least 5 organisations or community groups that have a core purpose of helping others in need?

There are millions of people without basic needs, such as clean water and food and shelter. It can be overwhelming to know there is so much need in the world. There is no one way to help. If you're not sure where to start - begin with your own family - look for opportunities to help out this week (without being asked).

11. How do you currently help others in your community. How can we be like the early Christians?
