## Discussion Questions

**Main Point:** Sin has damaged our relationship with God. We often fail to reflect God's image and fulfil our responsibilities to care for each other and creation. We should repent, seek to live differently, and live in anticipation of God renewing his creation.

### Warm-up questions

1. Have you ever been persuaded to do the wrong thing - even though you knew it was wrong? What were the consequences of this choice?

### **Read Genesis 3:14-19**

2. What was the one thing God had told Adam and Eve not to do?
3. How was Eve persuaded to do the wrong thing?
4. What were the consequences?
  - (a) for the serpent?
  - (b) for the woman?
  - (c) for the man?
5. Why was God also angry over what seemed to be a small act of eating a piece of fruit?

6. Do these consequences mean that God stopped loving his creation or that He has given up on it? How do we know?

7. What's one way you see brokenness in our world? (e.g. pollution, fighting, waste, hurt feelings)

8. How might you have contributed to that brokenness?

9. What does it mean to you that God will one day renew everything? How does that hope encourage you?

## Application

10. What's one thing you could do this week to 'live differently' and live a bit more like Jesus?

Lord God, We confess that we have sinned, that we have failed to reflect your image well, and that we have mistreated your world and each other.
