## Discussion Questions

Main Point: God gives his people special times to rest and remember him.

#### **Warm-up questions**

1. How much do you rely on calendars, timetables, routines, and programs? Share your weekly rhythms and what helps keep you on track.

#### Read Leviticus 23:1-32

- 2. Why do you think God set specific 'appointed times' for his people?
- 3. If God scheduled time to rest and celebrate, what does that say about his he wants us to live? Can you think of another section in the Bible (before Leviticus) where God acclaims rest?
- 4. Each festival helped people remember what God had done. Are there any moments in your life where you've seen God's faithfulness that are worth celebrating?
- 5. Many of the festivals God ordained were celebrated together as a people. Why do you think it's important to gather as a community of faith? How does celebrating or worshipping with others strengthen your relationship with God?



- 6. The day of atonement was about repentance and forgiveness. How does it feel to know that Jesus bridged the gap between our unholiness and God's holiness?
- 7. What do you think true rest looks like
  - (a) from an Old Testament view?
  - (b) from a modern societal view?
  - (c) from a modern Christian view?
- 8. How easy or hard is it for you to take a break from work, school, your friends, or technology?
- 9. What could a 'Sabbath rhythm' look like in your week?
