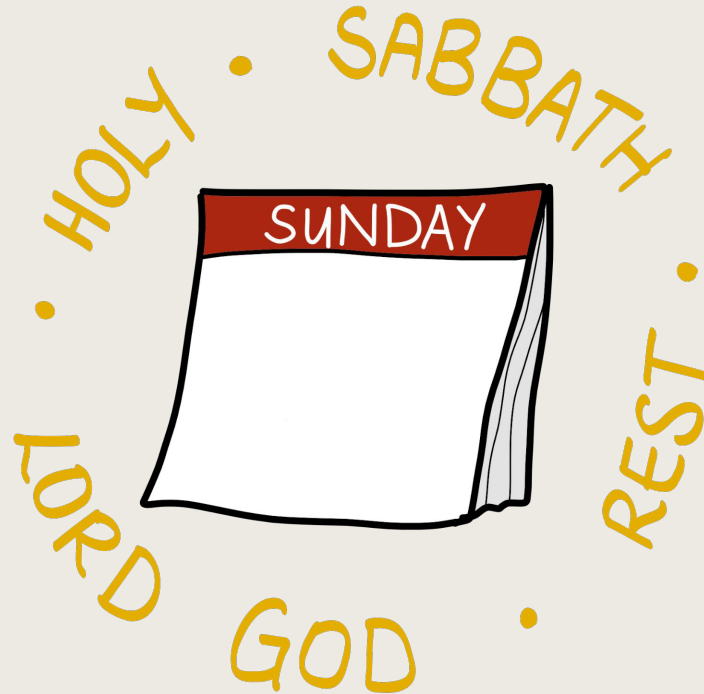

God gives his people special times to rest and remember him.

SERIES OVERVIEW

Leviticus

Leviticus describes how God graciously paved a way for his people to dwell in his presence, and points to how that would be ultimately fulfilled in Christ. Holiness is not only God's character, but a call for his people that can only be realised in him.

To the modern ear, many of the laws, rituals, purity demands, and sacrifices described in Leviticus can seem strange and unfamiliar—perhaps even out of place in light of the Gospel. But actually, Leviticus instructs us on the nature of atonement and how God would ultimately restore sinners to holiness through his costly provision for forgiveness.

In this six-part series, we'll explore: how God graciously provided a way for his unholy people to dwell with him; the call on God's people to live holy lives; and how God would ultimately provide a way in order that we might dwell with him forever.

TEACHING TIME

Holy People and Holy Time

The Jews had a whole calendar of special days to rest and remember God. Leviticus records the instructions that God gave to Moses about how to live. In Leviticus 23 God teaches his people about special times - holy times - reminding them of how much they needed him.

You might remember that there was one special day each week when everyone rested and worshipped God together. This was called the Sabbath. But there was a rhythm throughout the year that helped people remember specific things about God - and how much they needed God.

- The feast of Passover helped them remember how God had rescued them out of Egypt.
- The feast of Unleavened Bread reminded them that God rescued them so quickly that they didn't even have time to wait for the bread to rise.
- The feast of FirstFruits and the Feast of Weeks was when they offered God the very best of their harvest. Or of their animals. - because God should be given the very best.

- The feast of trumpets which was a day to stop and prepare their hearts for God.
- The Day of Atonement was a very serious day when people asked God to forgive their sins (and He always did).

Today we still need to rest and remember how much we need God.

Even though we don't have all these special days and feasts, we do set rhythms to remind us to focus on God. Every Sunday, we can come to church to remind ourselves how special it was that Jesus came and died for us and our sins are forgiven. Some of us might have daily rhythms of reading the bible and praying to God.

Other rhythms include Christmas - which we set aside to celebrate that God came to Earth to live with us and Easter - which reminds us of Jesus' crucifixion and also celebrates that he rose again to live with us.

15-21 FESTIVAL OF WEEKS : 50 days after the seventh Sabbath, bring to the Lord two loaves of bread that are made with seven pounds of the finest flour and yeast. Also bring seven male lambs, one young bull and two rams as a burnt offering; and a male goat, and two lambs for a friendship offering.

22-23 When gathering your crops, do not harvest everything. Leave some for the poor people and the outsiders who live among you.



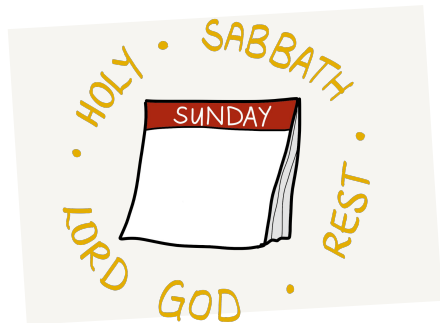
24-25 THE FESTIVAL OF TRUMPETS:
The first day of the seventh month will be a day of sabbath rest. There is to be a special service announced with trumpet blasts. Don't do any work on that day, but bring a food offering to the Lord.

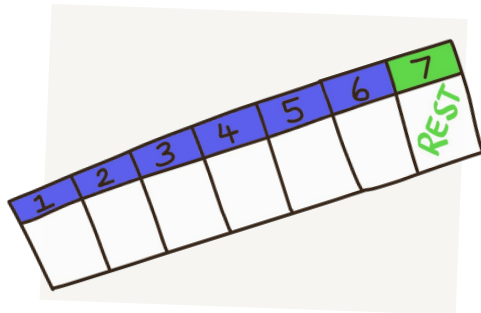

26-32 The tenth day of the seventh month is the day of atonement. Come together for a special service and bring a food offering to the Lord. Do not eat or do any work on that day - it is to be a day of rest.”

Ch23 vs1-2 The Lord said to Moses, “Tell the Israelites that these are the appointed feast days of the Lord. Tell the people that they must come together for these sacred assemblies.”



3 There are six days when you can work. But the seventh day is a day of sabbath rest. Come together on that sacred day. It is a Sabbath day to rest and honour the Lord.

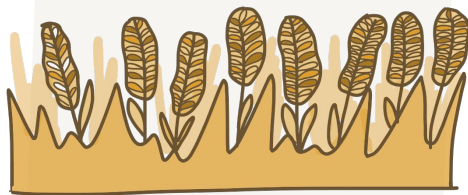


4-5 Here are the Lord’s appointed feasts where you must come together. The Lord’s Passover begins when the sun goes down on the 14th day of the first month.

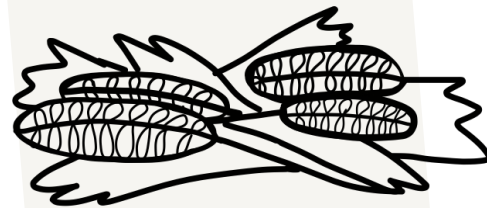
Middle Primary



4-8 The Lord's Feast of Unleavened Bread begins on the 15th day of that month. For seven days you must eat bread made without yeast and bring a food offering to the Lord.

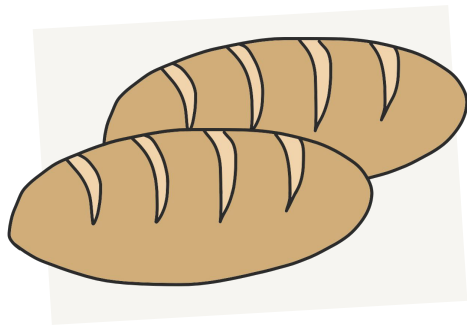


9-13 When you enter the land I am going to give you, bring an offering to the Lord. Gather your crops. Bring the first bundle of grain to the priest along with a lamb and a wine offering.

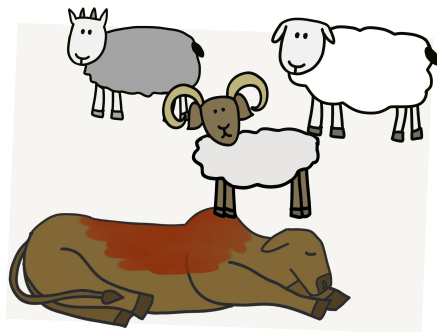


14 You must not eat any bread until the day you bring your offering to the Lord your God. You must not eat any cooked grain or any of your first grain until that time.

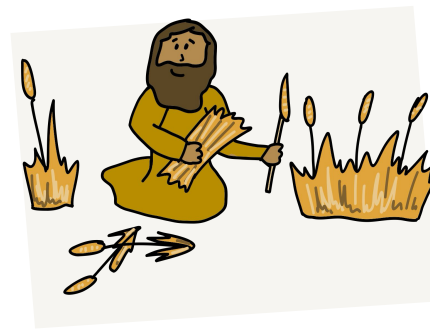
Middle Primary



15-17 Then 50 days after the seventh Sabbath, bring to the Lord an offering of your first grain. Bring two loaves of bread that are made with seven pounds of the finest flour and yeast.



18-21 Also bring seven male lambs, one young bull and two rams as a burnt offering; and a male goat, and two lambs for a friendship offering.



22-23 When gathering your crops, do not harvest all the way to the edges of your field and do not pick up the grain you missed. Leave some for the poor people and the outsiders who live among you. I am the Lord your God.”

Middle Primary

SABBATH



24-25 The first day of the seventh month will be a day of sabbath rest. There is to be a special service announced with trumpet blasts. Don't do any work on that day, but bring a food offering to the Lord.

Day of Atonement

26-32 The tenth day of the seventh month is the day of atonement. Come together for a special service and bring a food offering to the Lord. Do not eat or do any work on that day - it is to be a day of rest."

Read Leviticus 23: 1-32 (from SBK Lower Primary Scripture)

God told Moses that the people should celebrate feast days throughout the year. These would be sacred (holy) days and everyone would come together.

1. **Sabbath Day was held every week at the end of 6 days of work. How were they to spend Sabbath?**

It was a day to rest and to honour God. We celebrate like that on Sunday.

How can we make our Sundays special? Children might suggest giving up some screen time or playtime so their family can spend more time with God.

2. **Passover happened every year. Can you remember what it celebrated?** It was a special day to remember who God how God rescued them from slavery in Egypt.
3. **Feast of Unleavened Bread was held the next day and lasted for a week. How did they celebrate it?** They only ate bread that had no yeast - like pita bread. It reminded them that God's rescue was so quick that they hadn't had time to make bread with yeast.

4. **The Offering of Firstfruits and the Festival of Weeks celebrated the harvest. How did they celebrate?**

The people would bring to God the best of their grain and animals as an offering to him. It was another way of honouring God because he deserves the very best.

Another way of honouring God was to help the poor. How did they do that at harvest time? By leaving some of their grain for poor families to collect so they would have enough food.

5. **Festival of Trumpets was once a year. What happened on that day?**

Trumpets were blown to announce that everyone should stop working so they could rest and bring an offering to God.

6. **The Day of Atonement was 9 days after the Festival of Trumpets. What was so special about the Day of Atonement?**

It was the most special day of all - on this day

7. **Why do you think that God set all these special days?**
So that people could rest and remember how good he has been to them. And to say thank you. It was holy time.
8. **Are there ways that we could be better at taking 'holy time' to thank God for all his kindness to us?**

7. **Verses 24 & 25 describe the Feast of Trumpets. What was the focus of this day?**
To rest and to focus on God.
8. **Nine days later is the most holy day of the year. What have you learned about the Day of Atonement?**
Draw out that this day was the only time of the year when all the sins of the people could be forgiven. Animals would be sacrificed and one goat would be sent into the desert to remind people that God will forgive and forget our sins.

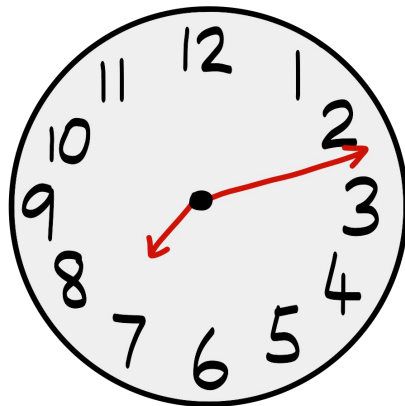
Clocks

Calendar Art

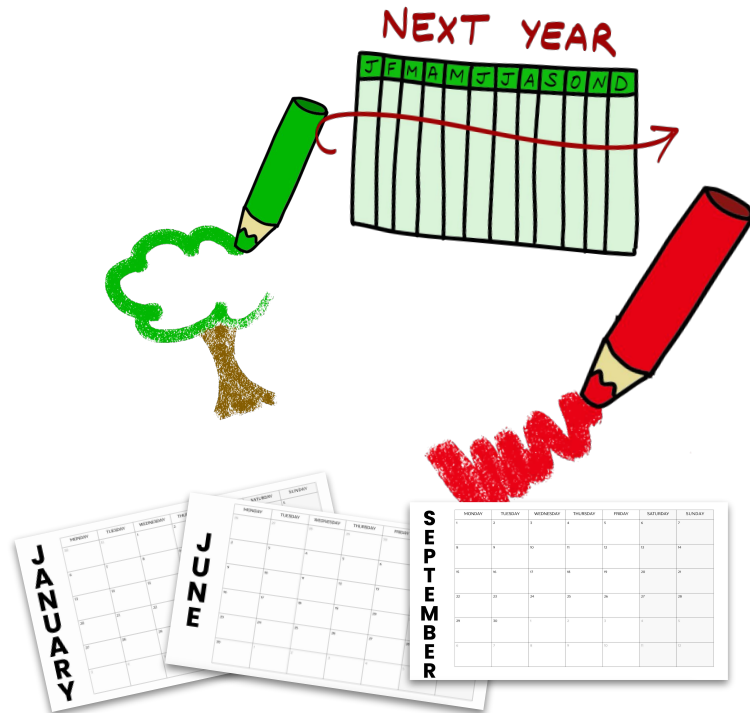
YOU'LL NEED...

STEPS

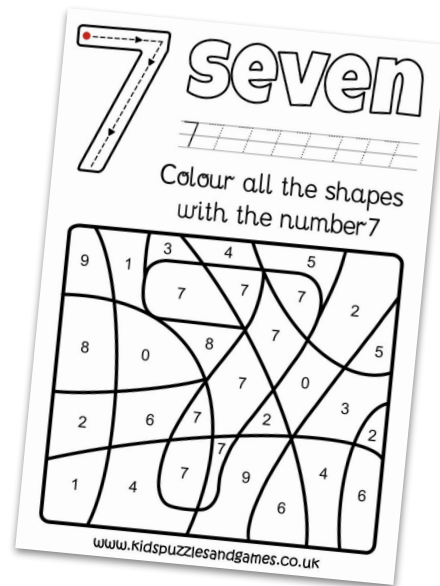

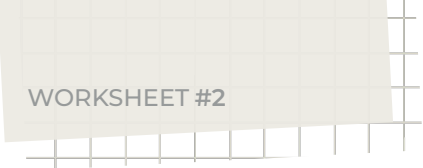
1. Show colour by number.

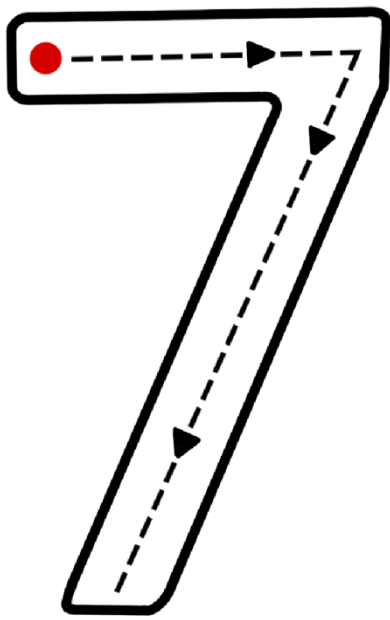

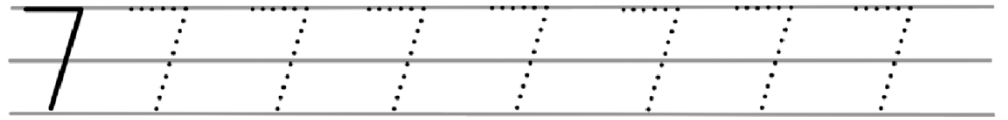

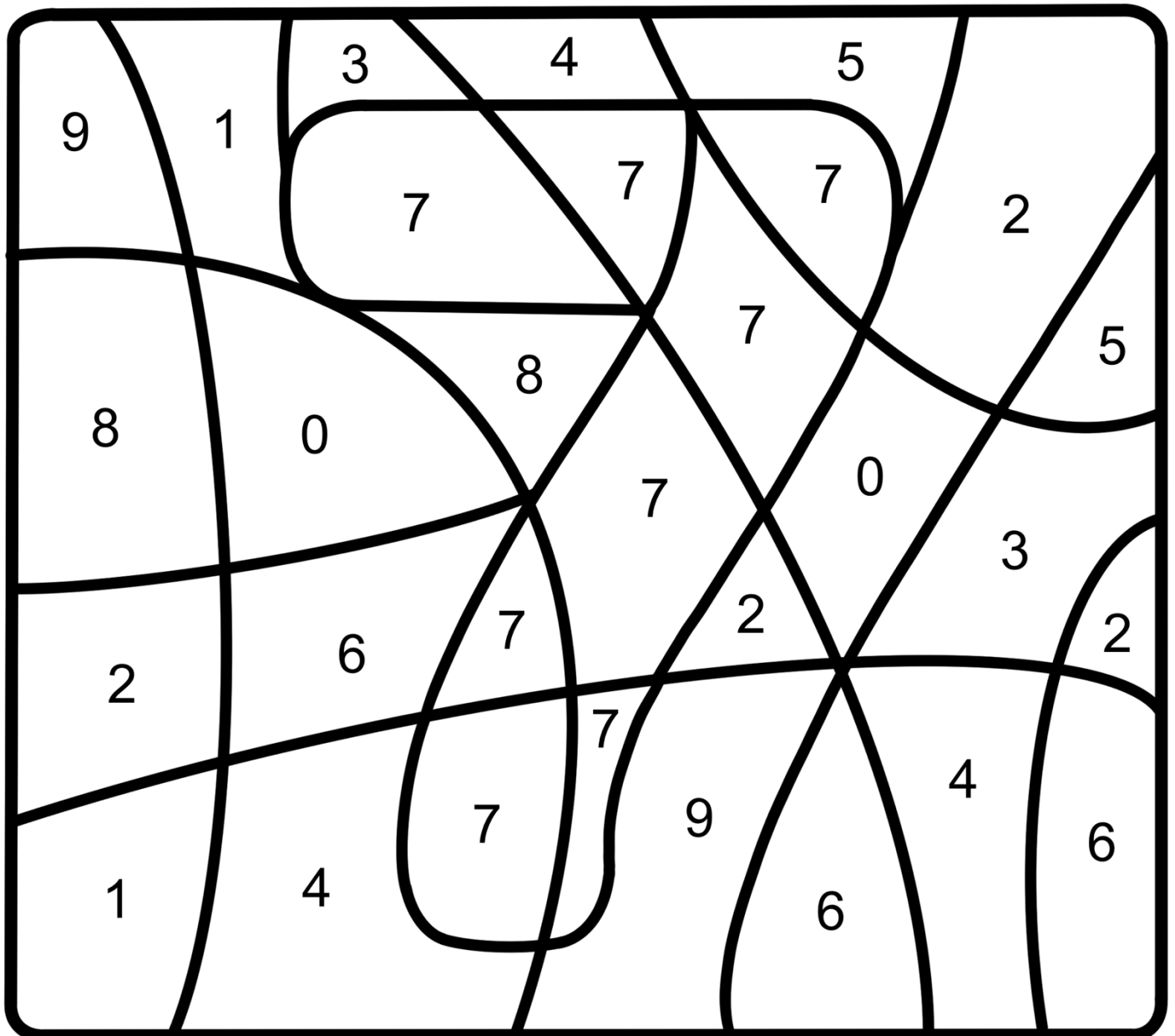

Hourglass Timer Tasks

YOU'LL NEED...

- Hourglass timer (plastic preferred)

STEPS

1. Show the children the hourglass timer and how it works to measure time (you might like to flip the hourglass and at the same time use a stopwatch to show that the hourglass lasts for 1 minute/60seconds).
2. Now that you have established the length of time measured by the hourglass, give some tasks to the children to try and complete within that time limit. Ideas might include:
 - Run around the perimeter of the space
 - How many star jumps
 - Build a tower using blocks
 - Draw chalkboard smiley faces
 - How many times they can write their name

60 seconds can sometimes feel like a long time and sometimes feel like not long at all! For God, it is just a tiny drop of sand compared to eternity. It is important to move and do, but it is also important to rest and remember God.

Roll and Erase the Number

YOU'LL NEED...

- Black Tuff tray (or tuff tray with whiteboard insert and whiteboard marker)
- Chalk marker (removable)
- Baby wipe, rag, or similar (to erase)
- 2 x dice

STEPS

1. Take a chalk marker and write numbers 2-12 on a tuff tray multiple times.
2. Invite the children to take turns rolling the dice and adding together the numbers. They are then to locate the number and erase that number using the wipe/rag/etc.
3. Repeat until all of the numbers have been erased.

Calendar Art

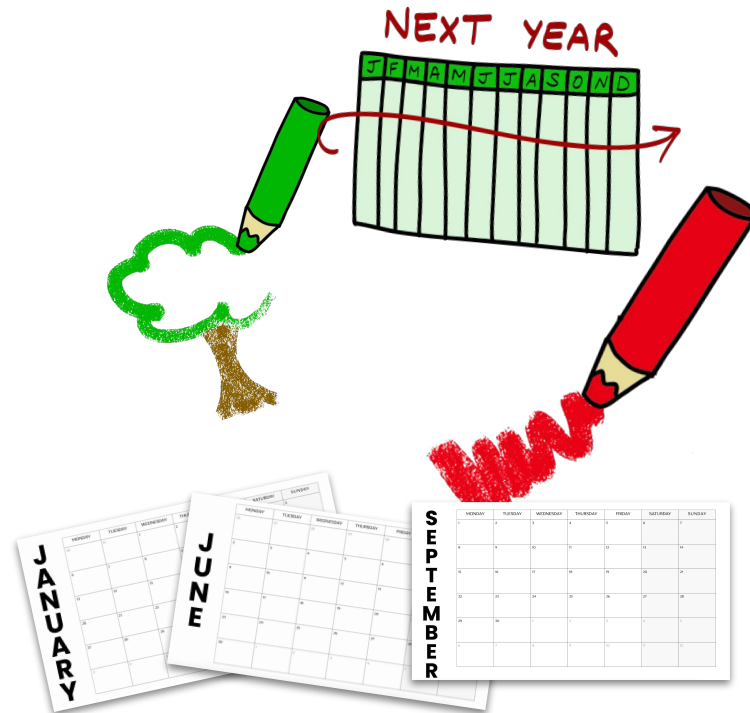
YOU'LL NEED...

STEPS

1. Ask the children to draw their impression of one of the following things:

 - Friends
 - Church
2. Encourage them to fill up the entire paper with their picture and colours.
3. Collect these and collate them back-to-back with the printed calendar month sheets.
4. Laminate the pages and bind to create a wall calendar. Display this in your learning space ready for next year!

Idea: Before laminating, you may wish to add significant church events and even children's birthdays to the calendar.

Wordsearch

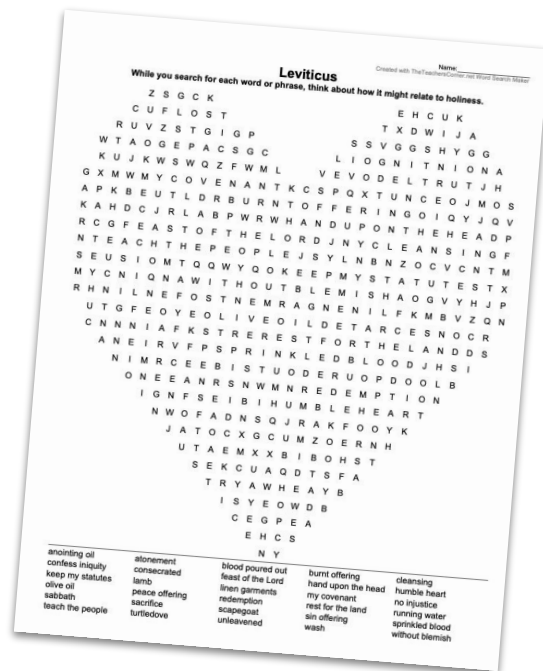
YOU'LL NEED...

2026 Calendar

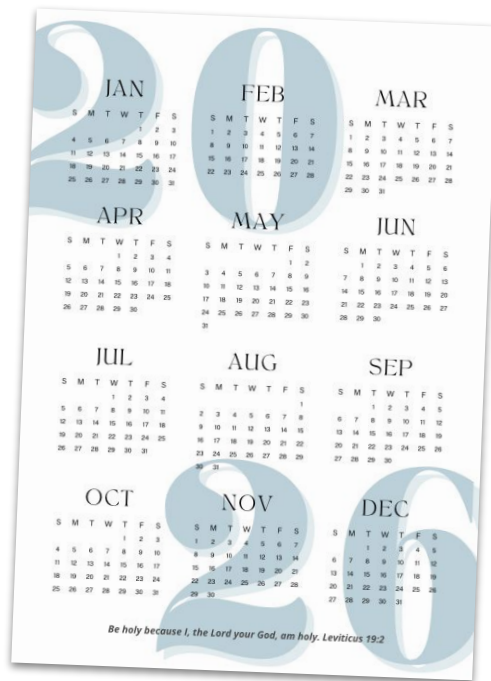
YOU'LL NEED...

STEPS

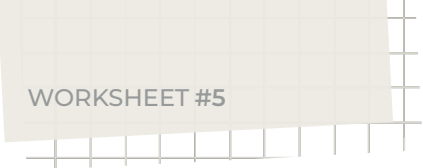
1. Provide the children with a printed copy of next year's calendar. We suggest just creating an A4 wall calendar (year view) for this.
2. You may like to laminate the calendars if you think they are more likely to be used/displayed in households. On the calendar included in this document, we included the verse Leviticus 19:2 so that they children might be reminded of this series and our call to be like God and to rest in God.
3. Encourage the children to do the following:
 - * circle relevant public holidays for their region
 - * circle special family celebration dates (i.e., birthdays etc)
 - * shade in school holidays
4. Now have a discussion about how they might approach their new year - in terms of thinking about time from God's perspective. Try and get the children to think about ways they might carve out rest and time with God and to mark these also on the calendars.

GAME: What's the time Mr Wolf?

YOU'LL NEED...

- N/A

STEPS

1. Select one child to be the "Wolf". All other children to line up on the other side of the room.
2. Everyone is to call out in unison "What's the time Mr Wolf?"
3. The "Wolf" answers with a time (e.g. 1 o'clock, 4 o'clock). The children are to step forward, with the number of steps matching the time. The aim is to get to the other end first and touch the "Wolf".
4. If the "Wolf" yells out "Dinner time" - you must avoid getting eaten! The "Wolf" tries to tag as many people as possible, while everyone tries to get back to the starting position.
5. To mix it up: play different rounds with the children crawling, hopping, or jumping with two feet together.

THEME

Holy People and Holy Time

STEPS

1. Split the children into multi-aged teams. Teams can be any size. Each team needs to have a clipboard and copy of Worksheet #5, a pen, and a person to act as scribe.
2. Begin the first round by rolling the letter die (we used an [online version](#) that also had a timer).
3. Once the dice is rolled, players look in the Bible to try and find 5 words beginning with that letter. Answers must be from the book of Leviticus and must begin with the designated letter for that round. If they are able to find a name of a person, place, festival, or law that begins with that letter - they are worth 5 points each!
4. Allow between 60-120 seconds for each round. Then gather answers from the groups and designate points for correct answers.
5. Repeat steps 2-4 for further rounds, ensuring a different letter is selected for each round.
