SERIES OVERVIEW

30th November 2025

Advent

From the earliest of Christian times, advent has been a season of waiting in eager anticipation of Christ's return. In fact, the traditional church calendar doesn't begin on January 1, but with the first Sunday of advent: we begin our Christian year in waiting! Not with "...the merriment of Christmas or the triumph of Easter. We do not begin with the work of the church or the mandate of the Great Commission. Instead, we begin in a place of yearning." We wait with eyes and hearts ready to receive our King, but also looking back, rejoicing in God's faithfulness in coming to us throughout human history.

Advent reminds us that we're invited into a relationship with the living God, who comes in Scripture's story, who came in person, as promised, and will come in glory.

TEACHING TIME

Hope: The Promise of a Saviour

When God rescued the Israelites from Egypt, .they were so grateful that they promised to follow him always. But instead, they slipped into patterns of disobeying him. They forgot about all the promises God had made to look after them. Instead they ignored him, treated poor people badly - and even ;worshipped other gods.

God kept warning them that he would judge them- so when very strong enemy nations came to attack them, they were very afraid.

They knew that they were in a very dark place - and it was all their fault.

But God never forgets his people. He sent his prophet Isaiah to promise them that light was coming! God would send someone to rescue his people from their darkness. Their enemies would be defeated. Help was on its way. Hope was on its way. Imagine how they felt to hear this

And that hope would be fulfilled when a special baby was born to be a new King. This king would be much greater than David - who was the greatest King that Israel had ever had.

He will be a king who would rule with wisdom and power. He will always be just and good. He will bring peace to all people everywhere. .

And best of all - this King will reign forever. His Kingdom will never end because he is God.

Who is this baby born to be King? It's Jesus - he's the light of the world. He is the Saviour who was promised He came to live with us and to show us what God is like. And he came to die for us. . Right now, he is with his Father; but one day he will return to earth and set up his Kingdom.

And so Jesus brings hope to ALL the world- not just because he will one day return to be the perfect King, but because here and now, we can ask Jesus to be the King of our lives.

So at Christmas, when we light candles or wave glowsticks, we remember that Jesus will always be our Light. When things seem dark. Jesus has promised to be with us. And when things get hard, he is the one we turn to for Hope.

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

View SBK ebook Hope (Isaiah 9:2-7)

- 1. What is the opposite of dark? Light
- 2. What are some places that are dark? How do you feel when you are in the dark?

Dark places could include: night time, in a cupboard. in the ocean underwater, in bed, in a box..... Being in the dark might make us feel scared, lonely, unhappy, frightened, unsure, etc.

3. How does light help us?

It helps us see! Without light, we might have difficulty moving around safely. Without light we would be more likely to put things in the wrong spot or to break things. Without light we would always be unsure where we were and what things looked like.

- 4. Isaiah was writing to God's people, who were sad and upset because they had been in a dark and scary time with enemies attacking them. They needed hope. What did God promise them? He promised them light! It would make them all very happy. They wouldn't be afraid.
- 5. And who would God send to help them? God was going to send them a Messiah - Jesus. He's the light of the world

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

Read Isaiah 9:2-7 from SBK Lower Primary Scripture

- 1. How do you feel when you are in the dark? Being in the dark might make us feel scared, lonely, unhappy, frightened, unsure, etc.
- 2. What different does light make when you are in a dark place?

It helps us see! Without light, we might have difficulty moving around safely. Without light we would be more likely to put things in the wrong spot or to break things. Without light we would always be unsure where we were and what things looked like.

3. Who are 'the people' that Isaiah is talking about? When Isaiah talks about 'the people', he is talking about the Israelites and referring to their 'dark' situation because their enemies are coming very close.

They are very afraid.

4. Isaiah tells them that God has promised someone who will come to be a light in their darkness; one who will rescue the people and be a great king. Who is Isaiah talking about?

Jesus! He will bring hope and light. And he comes to bring hope and salvation for all. 5. Isaiah was writing not just to the Israelites many vears ago, but his message is also for us! How do we sometimes live in darkness?

Darkness is an image for being lost in sin. And sin is what separates us from God. But trusting in Jesus for forgiveness, means that he becomes king in our lives and is with is every day. He brings us hope.

6. How will Jesus be the best King ever? He is wise and mighty (powerful). He brings peace. He is our forever Kina!

Read Isaiah 9:2-7 from SBK Middle Primary Scripture

- Do you think that the world can be a dark place today? Children may talk about things in their lives that make them sad or afraid; or about wider circumstances in the world.
- 2. What is the promise that Isaiah brings to the people of Israel who felt that their world was very dark? A great light will come into their darkness. Remind the children that the people were living darkness because they had forgotten God.
- What hope will this light bring? List all the things mentioned in verses 3-5.

He will reign forever. His kingdom will never end. The kingdom has already begun, but it will be here completely when Jesus comes back to reign. .

How do you think Jesus really is a light in the darkness and our salvation today?

- 1. Set out the printouts for the children.
- 2. With adult supervision, assist the children to select pieces of cellophane and glue them on to the printout so that the candle 'lights up'
- 3. Talk with the children about how the Lord is our light, and his light keeps us safe from the darkness.

- Laminated printout of the children's names
- Scrabble tiles

STEPS

- 1. Scatter the scrabble tiles on the floor in the centre of the circle, ensuring that all tiles have the letters are facing upwards.
- 2. Start by asking the children the first letter of their name, and then ask the children to find this letter.
- 3. Ask the children to try and find all of the letters of their name using their name printout as a guide, and place them on the floor in front of them.
- 4. If there is extra time, the children can try and spell the names of other children in the group or the group leader.

Star of Light

YOU'LL NEED...

- Die-cut stars (on thick card) (worksheet #3)
- Scissors
- Hole punch
- string/curling ribbon

STEPS

- 1. Pre-print the star shapes onto heavy card.
- To make one 3D star, each child will need 2 of the star shapes (with the different names printed on).
- Have the children cut along the dotted lines. Then matching the two stars, place them at a 90 degree angle and slot together.
- 4. Using a hole-punch, add a hole to the top of one of the stars.
- 5. Add ribbon and hang up in your Children's Ministry space.





YOU'LL NEED...

- Tall Dinner Candles
- Printout of Bible Verse (Worksheet #4)
- Scissors

STEPS

- Give each child a single dinner candle candle.
- 2. Have the children cut out a scripture verse each.
- 3. Wrap the verse around the candle and using pins, secure in place.





CHARACTERISTICS OF JESUS

1. Together recap a list of all the characteristics that Isaiah lists in 9:2-7 about Jesus

CHARACTERISTICS OF a CHARACTER Play a game of headbandz, where the children have to guess their character from their different characteristics. Main Point: knowing lots of characteristics about a person can help us understand who

- 2 Select a child to be the one to wear the headband and to have a 'character' on display. All of the others in the group may see what it it/says but not the child wearing it.
- 3. They ask up to 20 questions that require only a yes/no answer.
- 4. Repeat for a few children.
