## TEACHING TIME

## Together as Community

Last week, we learned that we can belong to two families: the family we live with-and God's forever family, that we belong to when we trust in Jesus.

'Church' is another name for all the people who belong to God's forever family. Church is not just a building. It's the community of people who love Jesus and care for each other.

When Paul was writing to the Ephesian Christians, there were Jewish people in the church community - and Gentiles (people who were not Jews).

God first gave his promises to the Jews. So if you were not a Jew, the bad news was, you were far away from God. You were not part of his special family. Often Jews and Gentiles hated each other.

But because God wanted *all* people to be able to be part of his family, he sent us Jesus. Jesus died on the cross so that everyone who trusts in him, could be included in God's family. So the Jews and Gentiles can now be together in God's family. They became one in Christ,

We are 'one in Christ' too! Look around: we're all very different. But God is making us into one community.

Paul says that one way to think about what it means to be community, is to think of the church like a building.

All the teachings of the Bible are the foundation. And Jesus is like the cornerstone of the building: the most important stone a builder places where the 2 walls meet, so that the building will be strong. Our church community can only be strong when it is built on Jesus and the Bible.

Every one of us is an important 'stone'. God has made us all different. But he takes our unique gifts, experiences and personalities, and builds us together..

God wants us to be a community of peace and hope. And he has given us the Holy Spirit to help us to care for one another., and to make sure that there are no barriers between us.

And this community of God's people is meeting across the world today as millions of people gather to worship God and to love each other,

Together, we're all one in Christ.

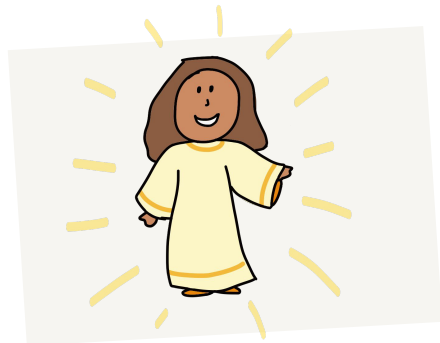
17-18 He came and preached peace to those were far away. He also preached peace to those who were near. Through Christ we both come to the Father by the power of one Holy Spirit.

21 Jesus is the one who holds the whole building together and helps point everyone to God.



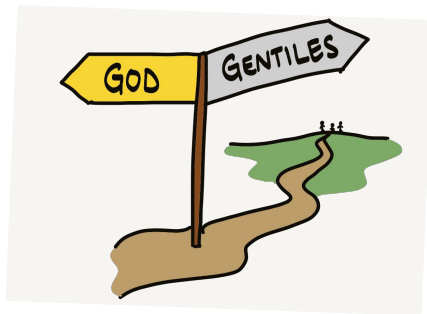
22 Because you belong to Christ, you are one in Christ and have the Holy Spirit in you.

12 Before you believed in Christ, you were separated from him. You were not considered to be citizens of Israel. You were not included in the promises to Israel.



13 You were without hope and without God in the world. Though you were far away from God before, you now belong to Christ Jesus because he died for you. This has brought you near to God.

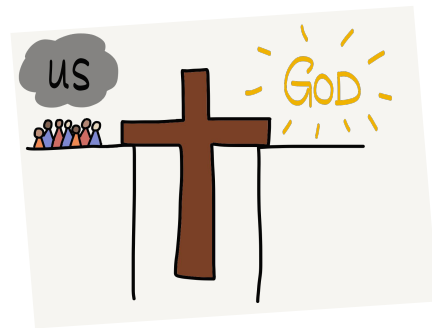
## Middle Primary



14 Christ himself is our peace. He has made Jews and Gentiles into one group of people without hatred between them.



15 Through his body on the cross, Christ set aside the law with all its commands and rules. He planned to create one new people out of Jews and Gentiles and make peace between them.



16 He planned to bring both them back to God as one body through the cross. On that cross, Christ put to death their hatred toward one another.



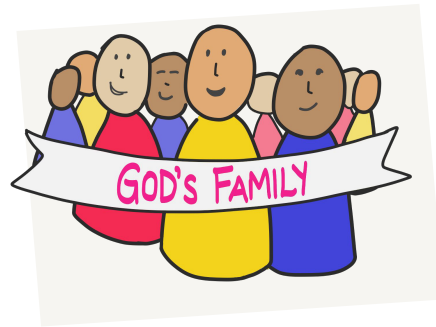

17 He came and preached peace to you who were far away, and peace to those who were near.



18 Through Christ we both come to the Father by the power of one Holy Spirit.



19 So you are no longer outsiders and strangers. You are citizens together with God's people. You are also members of God's family.

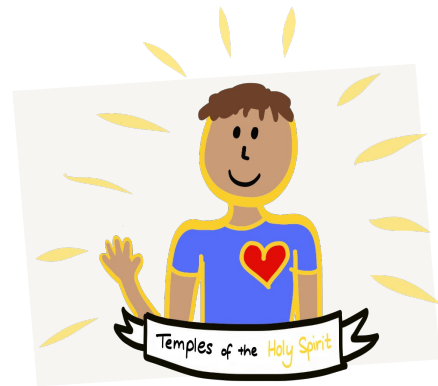

20 You are like a house that God is building for himself. God's apostles and his prophets are like the foundation under the house. Jesus Christ is like the most important stone in the house.



21 He makes the whole building stand together strongly. In that way, all God's people together become like a special house that belongs to the Lord.



22 Because you belong to Christ, God is building you all together to become his house. That is where God lives by his Spirit.

## Read SBK Lower Primary Scripture (Ephesians 2:11-22)

- What do you enjoy most about belonging to this community at church and Kids Church?**
- When Paul wrote this letter, he reminded people what it was like before they had trusted in Jesus. What would have made them sad?**  
They were separated from God. They couldn't be part of his family. They had no hope.
- What difference did Jesus make?**  
He died for us so that we could belong to his family forever.
- How is Jesus our peace?**  
He makes us like one family.  
There doesn't need to be any hate.  
No one needs to feel as if they don't belong.  
In God's family, there's room for everyone who trusts in Jesus.
- Who is the most important person in this family?**  
Jesus. He holds us all together. The Bible says that we are 'one in Christ'.
- How can we make people feel welcome in God's family?**  
We can talk to them about Jesus. Be kind and thoughtful. Make sure that no one feels left out.

Read SBK Middle Primary Scripture (Ephesians 2:11-22)

- What are the things that help you feel as if you belong to the church community here?**
- Read verses 11-13. What was it like for the Gentiles (non-Jews) before they believed in Jesus?**  
They were separated from Jesus. - and far away from God. They had no hope of ever knowing God.
- How has Jesus brought us all near to God?**  
He died for everyone. Now everyone can belong to God's family.
- Do you think anyone is too far away to know God?**  
No. Jesus has removed every barrier in belonging to his family. It doesn't matter how hard their heart may seem, or how physically far away they live, God can work to bring them close
- Jews and Gentiles were used to hating each other. Read verses 14-16. What difference did Jesus make to that bad relationship?**  
He brought peace. Now everyone can be counted as part of God's family. There are no longer laws and rules that separated Jews from Gentiles. Now there is no need for hatred - we are part of a new community together. In Christ.

**6. Read verses 17-19. How is this new community different?**

There is peace. There are no strangers: we're family. No one will ever get kicked out because our membership doesn't depend on what we have done but what Jesus has done!

**7. Read verses 20-21. How is God's church/community like a building?**

The foundation of our church is the teachings of the prophets (like Moses, Isaiah, Daniel, Jesus) and apostles (like Peter, John, Matthew, Paul). Jesus is the most important stone. We copy the structure he has set. We are all unique 'stones' but every one is important.

**8. What do you think you can contribute to make our community here even stronger?**

Encourage each child to think about what they bring to community - eg, kindness, encouragement, Biblical understanding, making sure no one feels left out. .

**9. Read v21. How does God 'live' in his community?**

He lives in us by his Spirit. He joins us together. He helps us to follow Jesus. We can trust the Holy Spirit to help us be a community that is 'one' and not divided.

## DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

Read Ephesians 2:11-22 in NIV Bible

- What are the things that help you feel as if you belong to the church community here?**
- Read verses 11-13. What was it like for the Gentiles (non-Jews) before they believed in Jesus?**  
They were separated from Jesus. - and far away from God. They had no hope of ever knowing God.  
**What is it like for them now they have become Christians?** They have been brought near to God.
- BACKGROUND to verses 14-17. Jews and Gentiles had hated each other for a long time.** God had chosen Israel (the Jews) to be a special group of people, and given them special laws to obey. Gentiles were everyone who doesn't belong to Israel. That includes us! There is nothing we can do to be a member/citizen of Israel.  
**How has Jesus' death changed everything?**  
Jesus' death means that everyone - Jew or Gentile - can be part of God's family. Now *together*, we can be at peace with God and each other. Jesus has removed hatred, and the laws that separated Jews from Gentiles: together we are part of a new community
- Do you think anyone is too far away to know God?**  
No. Jesus has removed every barrier in belonging to his family. It doesn't matter how hard their heart may seem, or how far away they live, God can bring them close.

- What hope does God offer everyone (vs18-19)?**  
Everyone can belong to God because Jesus has died for ALL people. No one can get kicked out because our membership is based on what Jesus has done, not what we have done!
- How is God's church/community like a building (v20-21)?** The foundation of our church is the teachings of the prophets (like Moses, Isaiah, Daniel, Jesus) and apostles (like Peter, John, Matthew, Paul). Jesus is the most important stone. We copy the structure he has set. We are all unique 'stones' but every one is important.
- What do you think you can contribute to make our community here even stronger?**  
Encourage each child to think about what they bring to community - eg, kindness, encouragement, Biblical understanding, making sure no one feels left out.
- How does God 'live' in his community v22?**  
He lives in the church by his Spirit. He joins us together. He helps us to follow Jesus., and to be 'one in Christ' - not divided.

# Children of the World

## YOU'LL NEED...

- Children of the World Felt Set

## STEPS

1. Pull out each of the felt images and show them to the children.
2. Play with the felt set. During play talk about:
  - \*The different clothes they are wearing.
  - \*What colours are they?
  - \*What country do they come from?
  - \*Are they the same?
  - \*Are they different?
  - \*Can we all be part of one family?
3. This is a good opportunity to have a discussion about how there are children living all over the world who are the same age as them. Ask if there are children in your group who were born overseas (or have family members who were born elsewhere).

# Sorting Objects

## YOU'LL NEED...

- Different coloured and different shaped blocks, Duplo, or similar

## STEPS

1. Sort all the blocks:
  - Sort by colour
  - Sort by shape
  - Sort from smallest to largest
  - Sort by number of knobs
2. Build:
  - Build the tallest wall you can with the lego.
  - Ask the Question: Who breaks down any wall between us and God? (Jesus does!)
  - Now turn the wall into a cross.

*Just like all the blocks, people can have lots of differences. Blocks can be sorted by colour, shape or size, they are all lego. We can all be different, but if we trust in Jesus, everyone can be part of God's family*

# Jenga Tower

## YOU'LL NEED...

- Jenga blocks (regular or giant size)

## STEPS

1. Divide children into groups of approximately 4-6.
  2. Have children take turns to remove ONE block at a time from the lower section and add this to the top.
- Rules:

- You can only use one hand.
- Any piece you touch, you have to take out.
- You can not take a piece from the top 3 layers of bricks.

See how tall you can build the tower. Challenge the groups to take a piece out from the bottom. What will happen?



## Link

*Even though God's People have continued to go their own way, God In Paul's letter to the Ephesians, he compares the family of God to a building - where Jesus is the cornerstone and the whole building is held together by him. Without Jesus, we have no church. to offer forgiveness and love.*

# God's Family Agamograph

## YOU'LL NEED...

- Printout of Worksheet #1
- Coloured Pencils
- Scissors
- Glue sticks

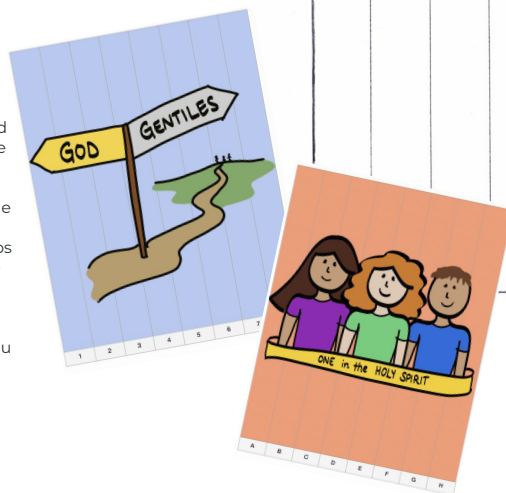
## STEPS

An agamograph is an optical illusion picture where two images are layered next to each other but the two pictures can be viewed independently, depending on the angle you look.

An example of how an Agamograph is made can be found in this [video](#).

Instructions on how to create one:

1. Cut IMAGE A out into strips, using the guidelines. Be sure to keep the numbers on the bottom.
2. Glue each of the strips onto the blank grid canvas, gluing the number 1 part onto the section number 1; gluing the number 2 part onto section number 2; and so on.
3. Now cut IMAGE B out into strips, using the guidelines. Be sure to keep the numbers on the bottom. Now glue each of the strips onto the blank grid canvas, matching the corresponding letters.
4. Concertina fold the page, back and forth along the join lines between each strip. Allow the page to sit zigzagged. When you hold and look along one side of the page you should see Image A, and when you look along the opposite side you should see Image B.

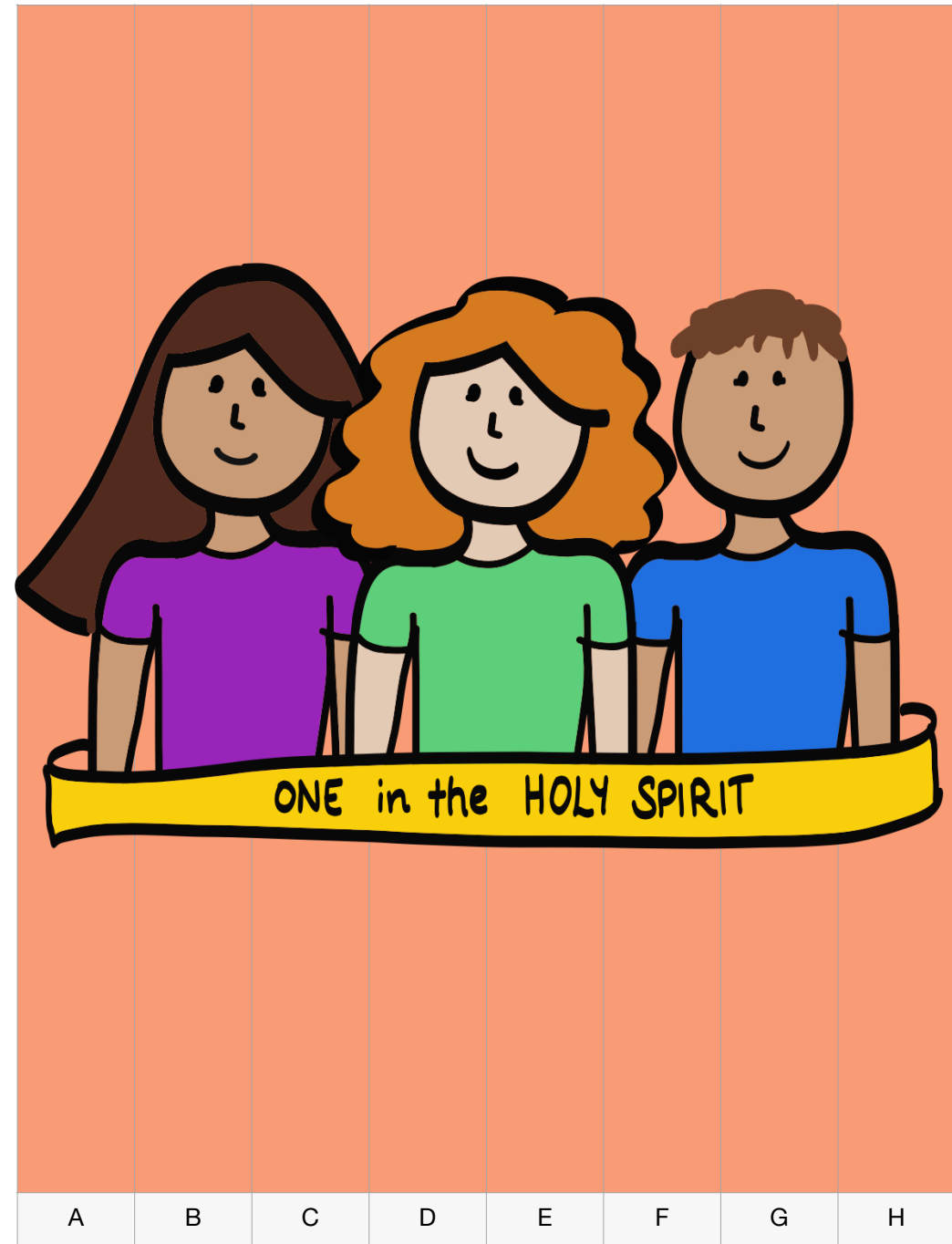

## STEPS

1. After discussing the content of this part of letter to the Ephesians, recap how Paul wanted the Jews and Gentiles to know that they were both part of God's family. Host a discussion on who can be included in God's family.
2. Hand out copies of the A to Z worksheet and see if the children can create an alphabetical list of those who God loves and adopts into his family.

*Encourage a variety of groups of people, rather than just a list of nationalities or a just list of characteristics.*

## GAME: The Sorting Game

### YOU'LL NEED...

- N/A

### STEPS

1. Have the children stand in a circle.
2. Call out different categories, for example: all children wearing red, all children with green eyes, all children with freckles, all children who have brothers, all children who have sisters, all children who enjoy playing at the park, etc.
3. After you read a category, have the children who meet the criteria come and stand in the center of the circle. Then have the children return to their places in the circle before you read the next category.
4. There are things that make us all different. And there are things that make us all the same.

## GAME: Human Knots

### YOU'LL NEED...

- Nil

### STEPS

1. Form teams of approximately 10 people in each team. Each team forms a circle and places one arm inside the circle. Each holds the hand of someone else but it cannot be the person next to them). They then place their other arm in the circle, holding the hand of a different person (it still can't be the person standing next to you.)
2. The aim of the game: Unknot everyone in the group, without letting go of each others' hands.
