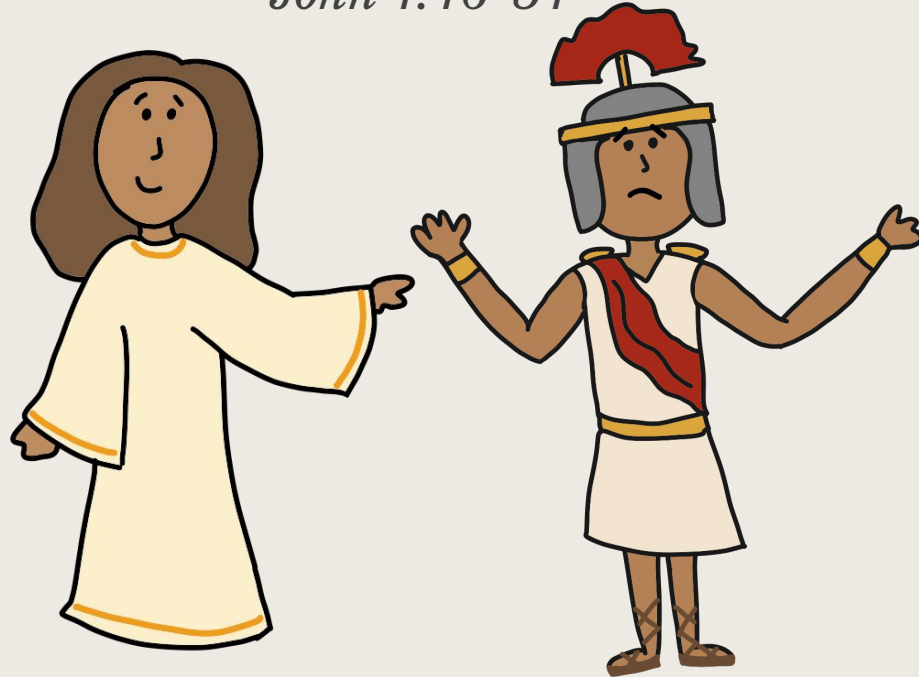

THIS WEEK'S FOCUS

Jesus' words are powerful. We can trust Jesus even when we can't see how things will work out.

SERIES OVERVIEW

The Gospel of John is unique in the New Testament. Where the Gospel of Mark begins with Jesus' launch into ministry, Luke opens with the foretelling of John the Baptist's birth, and Matthew commences with a summary of Jesus' genealogy, John transports us much further back: to the very beginning! In the beginning was the Word!

Right from the opening words of John, he not only shows us the supremacy and glory of Jesus, but he calls us to recognise and respond to Jesus. John's intent is not only to provide a faithful account of Jesus' life, death, and resurrection, but so that this news would cause a change in us. That we would believe that Jesus is the Messiah and Son of God. The purpose of John's Gospel—as Don Carson put it—is to make us believers.

TEACHING TIME

Healing Official's Son

When Jesus turned the water into wine at the wedding in Cana, some people followed him around, wanting to see another miracle. They were asking: is Jesus really God?

After a while, Jesus returned to Cana. One of the king's officials heard that Jesus was there - so he had travelled from his home town of Capernaum (on the Sea of Galilee) through the hills. It probably took a couple of days - but he needed to see Jesus badly. His son was very very sick.

He begged Jesus: *You have to come immediately. If you don't come, my son will die.*

But Jesus stays right where he is! Instead of accompanying the official back home to his son, he simply says to the man: *Go home. Your son will live.*

This was not what the man had asked for! Do you think he was disappointed? Surely Jesus would go to see the boy: to touch him or speak to him.

But the Bible simply says that the man believed Jesus and left on the long trip home.

And on his way, some of his servants from home, come in the opposite direction with the news that his son is completely well.

Imagine the excitement! Jesus could definitely be taken at his word. What he say is true.

No wonder everyone in the family - probably including the servants - believed in Jesus. He can be trusted. His word is powerful and true.

Jesus doesn't live among us in the same way as he did then,. We don't 'see' him in the way that the king's official did. But we can trust his word.

He is God - and he has made promises to care for us, to watch over us and to be with us wherever we are.

Share your testimony - or invite other leaders to share their testimonies - of how God the have trusted Jesus and he has answered their prayers.

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

Read SBK Middle Primary Scripture (John 4:46-54)

Begin by inviting children to share their own stories of trusting Jesus' word.

This week's story starts with a very anxious father and ends with a whole family coming to believe in Jesus!

1. Imagine you're the father (remember - you are one of the king's officials). What steps have you taken for your sick son? v 46-47

You've travelled to see Jesus and you've begged him to come back home to heal your son.

2. Why do you think Jesus says the words in v48 to you as the father?. He's not being rude. He's pointing out that some people will ONLY believe in Jesus if they see the miracle with their own eyes.. Is he one of them?

3. Read v49 and 50. What promise has Jesus made you (the father)?. Your son will live.. Why are you now willing to return home without Jesus?

You have trusted that his Word is enough. It is a promise that Jesus has made and you believe that if Jesus has said it, it will happen.

4. Read v51-53. What 2 discoveries do you make before you get home to Capernaum?

- Your son is now completely healed
- His healing took place *at the exact time* that Jesus had told you that he would be healed.

6. After you finally reach home, how does your whole family change?

They all become believers in Jesus.

Why? They have discovered that Jesus' word is powerful AND true.

7. How is this miracle a signpost to who Jesus is?

Jesus is the one who can give life by his word alone.

8. We can't yet see Jesus in the way that the king's official did. How can we still trust him?

His stories and words are written in the Bible and we can trust them because Jesus is powerful and he will keep every promise he has made.

Invite the children to name some of Jesus' promises: - to be with us all the time, to share all our worries, to care for us when we are lonely, to notice even the smallest things about us.

9. Pray together, silently voicing the things on our hearts and trusting Jesus to keep his promises.

Read John 4:46-54 in NIV Bible

Begin by inviting children to share their own stories of trusting Jesus' word.

This week's story starts with a very anxious father and ends with a whole family coming to believe in Jesus!

1. What steps has the father - a royal official - taken for his sick son v 46-47? What does this tell you about the man?

He loves his son very much: he could have sent his servants, but instead he's travelled personally to meet Jesus and beg him to come home with him.

2. Why do you think Jesus says the words in v48 to him? He's not being rude - but he is testing the man. Does he just want to see a miracle before he will trust Jesus? . (Explain that by now, lots of people had started following Jesus around so they could see a miracle with their own eyes.)

3. Read v49 and 50. What promise does Jesus make? Your son will live.. Why is the official willing to return to his son without Jesus? He trusts that Jesus' word is enough. If Jesus has said it, it will happen.

4. Read v51-53. What 2 discoveries does he make before he gets home to Capernaum?

- His son is now completely healed
- The healing took place *at the exact time* that Jesus told the father: *Your son will live*

6. What was the impact on the whole family?

They all become believers in Jesus. This would have included the servants as well!

Why? They have discovered that Jesus' word is powerful AND true.

7. How is this miracle a signpost to who Jesus is?

Jesus is the one who can give life by his word alone.

8. We can't yet see Jesus in the way that the king's official did. How can we still trust him?

His stories and words are written in the Bible and we can trust them because Jesus is powerful and he will keep every promise he has made.

Invite the children to name some of Jesus' promises: - to be with us all the time, to share all our worries, to care for us when we are lonely, to notice even the smallest things about us.

YOU'LL NEED...

- Play Medical Sets

STEPS

1. Have some play doctor's sets available for the children to play with.
2. Encourage them to pretend they are a medical worker and examining someone else - checking their pulse, heart beat, temperature, giving medicine, getting the patient to lie down, etc.
3. Talk about what doctors and nurses and medical staff do and their role in helping keep other people healthy.
4. Explain that while they can help use medicine to heal us, that in the story today Jesus healed the official's son just by saying the words.

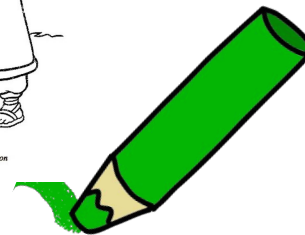

Jigsaw Match

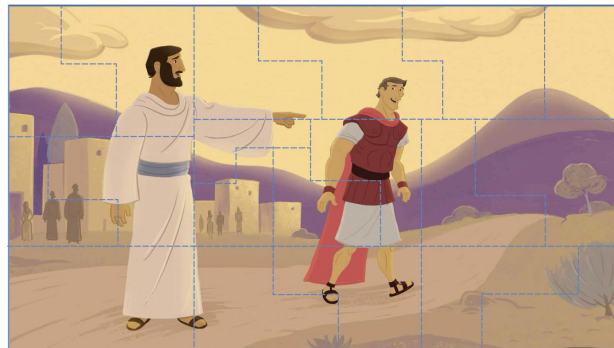
YOU'LL NEED...

STEPS

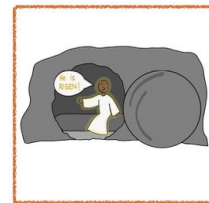

4. Continue playing until all pairs have been found.

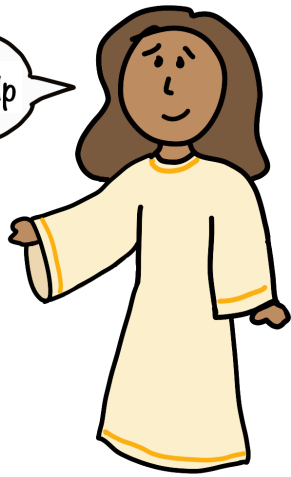

Spot the Difference

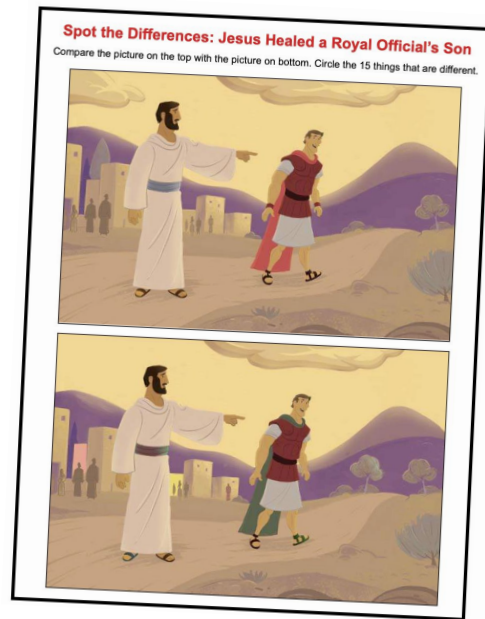
YOU'LL NEED...

- Printout of [Spot the Difference Worksheet \(from Sunday School Zone\)](#)
- Clipboards

STEPS

1. Hand out the Spot the Difference pages. Demonstrate how to locate and count each difference and circle this part of the picture on one of the images (the top one perhaps).
2. Optional: if finished, play a game of I Spy, each taking turns to select an object and have others guess what it is.
OR
If children are feeling artistic - get them to create their own 'spot the difference pictures' showing a scene from today's story.

- Provide each group with a printout of the scripture John 4:43-54.
- Allow space and time for each group to read through and then rehearse the scenes, acting out the story.
- Regroup at the end and have the children show cse their drama to the rest of the room.

GAME: Bandaid Relay

YOU'LL NEED...

- A3 Printout Worksheet #5 Sick people
- 2 Boxes of Band-aids
- Blu-tac

STEPS

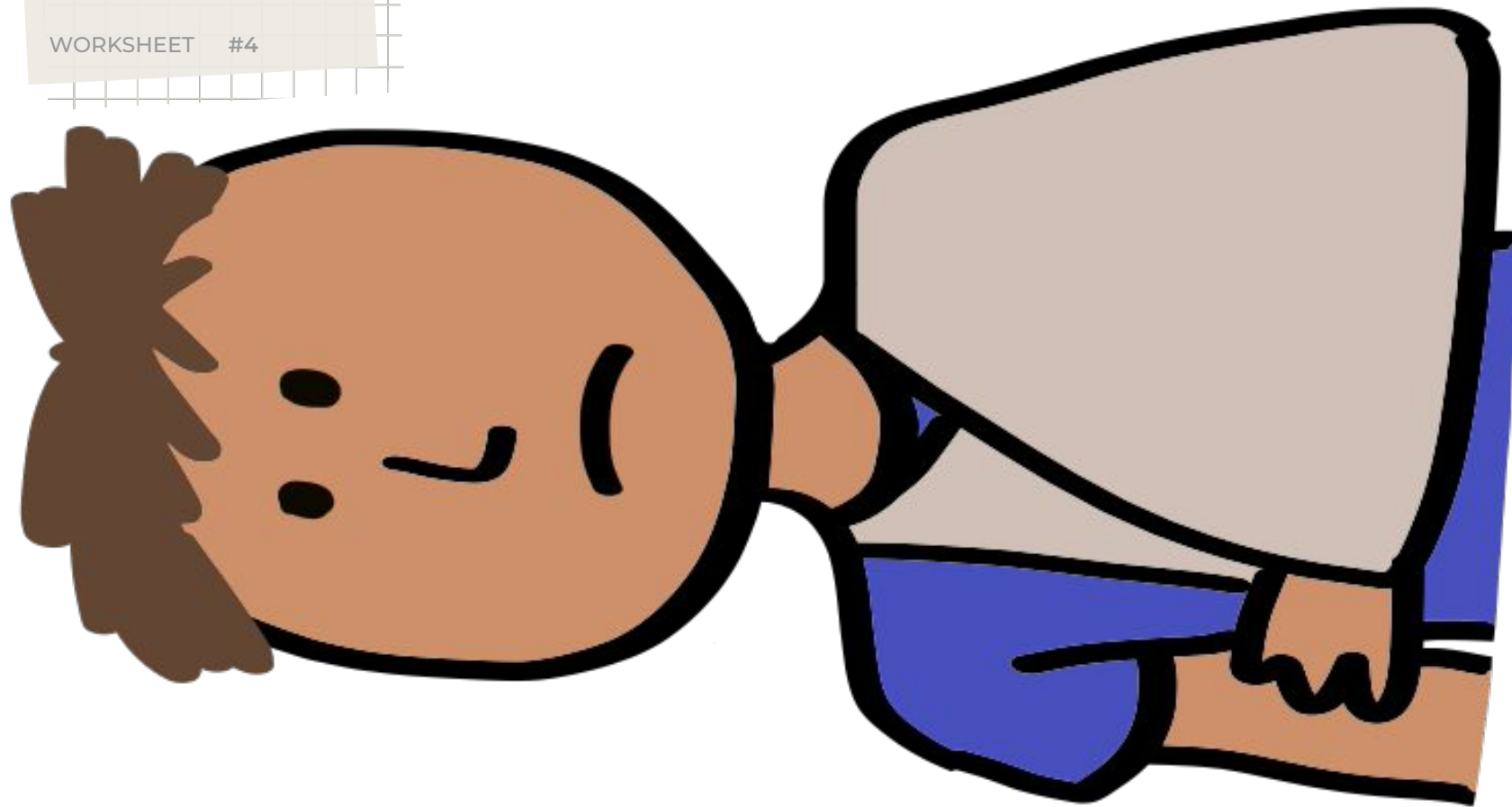
1. Blu-tac the "Sick people" posters at the end of the room.
2. Split the children into 2 teams.
3. Have a timer and set for 5 minutes (or a time of your choosing). Explain that the game is a relay, where each team sends one runner up to the poster at a time.
4. Once at the poster, they need to peel a bandaid wrapper off and stick the bandaid on the sick person (children may need help opening the bandaid).
5. When the timer is done, count how many bandaids each group got on their person to see who the winner is.

GAME: The Official is Coming!

YOU'LL NEED...

- N/A

STEPS

1. One leader to be the captain of the ship.
2. The captain is in charge of the ship and yelling out orders to the crew.
3. Crew members must obey all of the captain's orders.
4. Play continues with the captain calling and the crew responding. The faster the actions are called and performed, the trickier the game becomes.

CAPTAIN'S ORDERS:

Scrub the decks: crew members get on their hands and knees and pretend to scrub the deck.

Man overboard: crew members find a partner, hold hands and pretend to row a boat.

Climb the rigging: crew members pretend to climb a ladder.

Captain's coming: crew members salute and say "aye captain".

Hit the deck: crew members lay face down on the floor.

Four corners: there are four corners of the ship: back, front, left and right. When the captain yells out a corner all crew members must run to it.
