THIS WEEK'S FOCUS

Jesus really rose from the dead. He is alive, powerful, and still lovingly cares for his people.

SERIES OVERVIEW

The Gospel of John is unique in the New Testament. Where the Gospel of Mark begins with Jesus' launch into ministry, Luke opens with the foretelling of John the Baptist's birth, and Matthew commences with a summary of Jesus' genealogy, John transports us much further back: to the very beginning! In the beginning was the Word!

Right from the opening words of John, he not only shows us the supremacy and glory of Jesus, but he calls us to recognise and respond to Jesus. John's intent is not only to provide a faithful account of Jesus' life, death, and resurrection, but so that this news would cause a change in us. That we would believe that Jesus is the Messiah and Son of God. The purpose of John's Gospel—as Don Carson put it—is to make us believers.

TEACHING TIME

Do you believe?

Long ago, people believed things that we now know are not true

- the earth is flat
- left-handed people are bad
- chocolate milk comes from brown cows
- doctors don't need to wash their hands between patients

We don't believe those things now, because evidence proves them wrong.

Jesus claimed that he was sent by God, and that he was God. The disciples were eye-witnesses: they had seen things that absolutely proved to them that Jesus was God. It's why the Gospels were written.

Ask the children if they can remember the signs that Jesus was God that we have learned about: Water into wine, healing the official's son, healing a paralysed man, feeding 5000 people from one lunch, walking on water, giving sight to someone who had never been able to see, raising Lazarus from the dead, his own death and resurrection.

After he had been raised from the dead, Jesus appeared to his disciples several times. But one of the most special was a barbecue on the beach. And Jesus was the cook!

You'll remember that some of Jesus' disciples were experienced fishermen. So it's not surprising that one night, they decided to go fishing. It would have been very frustrating for them to come back to shore with NO fish.

And then someone they didn't recognise, told them to put their nets out again. And when they did, they couldn't count the number of fish they caught. So many that they couldn't even bring all the fish onto shore.

John said to Peter: *That's Jesus!* Peter jumped in and raced to shore. The stranger was Jesus and he'd been building a fire and already had some fish and bread ready. And then *everyone* knew it was Jesus. Jesus had died and was alive again. Jesus had proved he was God's son.

TOPIC

STEPS

1. Have the children play in pairs (or take turns in a small team).
2. Place all of the fish/sea creatures in the water (centre of the area).
3. Children take turns to use the fishing rods to try and catch a fish.
4. Repeat until all of the fish have been caught.

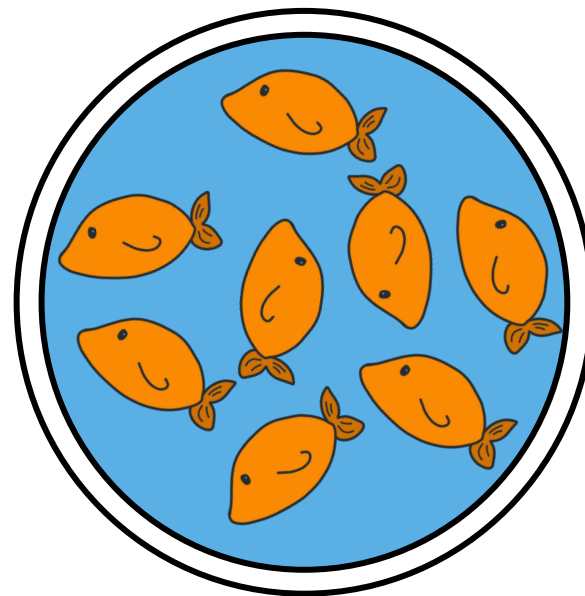

1. Handout the paper plates and pencils / crayons.
2. Encourage the children to colour in the paper plate to make a sea background.
3. Hand out the fish stickers and get the children to add the stickers to their paper plate.

YOU'LL NEED...

- Large container
- Different blue items, eg pom poms, cut up cellophane or tissue paper, etc
- Small toy boats, sea creatures

STEPS

1. Set up the sensory play by putting all the blue items in the large container as the water.
2. Add the boats and sea creatures.
3. As the children play talk to them about the disciples going fishing and Jesus standing on the shore, telling them to throw their net on the other side of the boat and catching lots of fish.

Boat and Shore

YOU'LL NEED...

- Chalk line/cement line

STEPS

1. Make a long, straight line on the ground. Arrange all the children so that they are behind the line. One side of the line is the "boat" and the other is the "shore".
2. The leaders calls out "boat" or "shore" and the children need to jump with two feet together to the boat or shore.
3. As you continue, start to say it faster, so the children have to quickly jump from one side to the other

Net Fishing

YOU'LL NEED...

- Net
- 1 x hula hoop
- Toy fish

STEPS

1. Get 2-4 children to hold the corners of the net and have the rest of the children stand back in a line.
2. Each take a turn to stand in the hula hoop and toss the fish into the net.

Beanbag Toss

YOU'LL NEED...

- Mini Beanbags
- Paper cut out fish

STEPS

1. Place the fish cutouts on the floor, scattered around the space.
2. Each child stands around the edge and takes turns to throw a mini beanbag on a fish.
3. If the beanbag lands on a fish they keep that fish.
4. Continue until all fish are gone.
5. Winner is child with the most fish.

Go Fish

YOU'LL NEED...

- Decks of cards (can use regular cards or Bible cards/SBK specific cards such as 'Gospel of Mark' cards)

SERIES

BIBLE FOCUS

John 21:1-14

TOPIC

Do you Believe?

STEPS

1. The object of the game is to be the person who has the most matching pairs.
2. Shuffle and deal 6 cards to each player. Place the remaining cards in a deck in the centre.
3. Players check to see if they have any pairs before starting. If so, these are placed face up on the floor in front of them.
4. Players take turns to ask another player for a specific card. For example: "Sarah - do you have a nine?"
5. If the person asked has the card, they must hand it over. If the answer is a no, the person is told to 'go fish' and must take a card from the centre deck.
6. Continue until all cards from the centre deck have been taken and all pairs have been found.

Challenge

YOU'LL NEED...

- Lego

SERIES

BIBLE FOCUS

TOPIC

Do you Believe?

STEPS

1. Round 1 - On their own:
Give the children a challenge that they have to build the tallest tower out of lego but with one arm behind their back.
2. Round 2 - With help:
This time give the children a lego base board and pair the children up (still with one arm behind their back) so they can help each other build the tallest tower.
3. Ask the children:
What was different between the two rounds?
How did it feel when things weren't working?
What changed when help was given?

GAME: Net Relay

YOU'LL NEED...

- Tea Towels
- Fish (toy or paper)

SERIES

STEPS

1. Have children work in pairs. Standing opposite each other, they hold the corners of the tea towel and place a fish in the middle, on the 'net'.
2. Have the children race from one end of the space to the other.
3. To make it more challenging add more fish to the 'net'.

TOPIC

STEPS

1. Place motorised fishing game in centre of room.
2. Split children into 4 teams, with each team placed in a different corner of the room. Each team is given a different colour - either green, blue, yellow, or red.
3. Teams take turns sending one runner each to the fishing game to see if they can 'catch' one of the fish in their team's colour. Once they catch a fish, they return to their team so the next runner can go.
4. Have a leader stand nearby to reset any of the caught fish back into the gameboard. Have another leader to keep score for each of the teams.
5. Set a timer for 5mins. The winning team is the team who catch the most fish within the time limit.

GAME: Catch the Fish

YOU'LL NEED...

- Motorised Magnetic Fishing Game
- 4 hula hoops (one for each team to stand behind)
- Timer on screen
