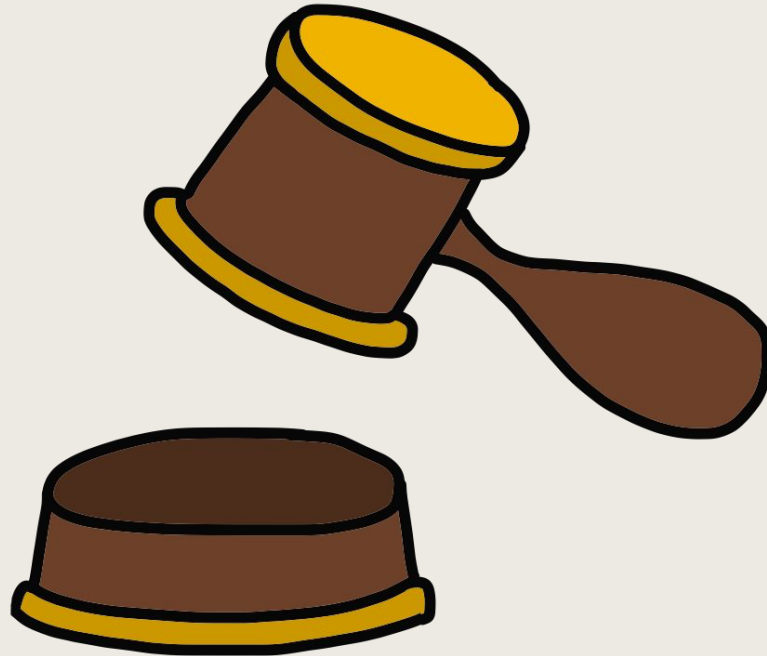

SERIES OVERVIEW

ROMANS - Strengthened by the Gospel

Paul's letter to the Romans is one of the most important pieces of written correspondence in all of human history. Formerly known as Saul of Tarsus, Paul—a Pharisee who actively persecuted Christians—had a radical encounter with the risen Lord Jesus and was commissioned by Jesus as an apostle to proclaim the Good News to the Gentiles (the world of non-Jewish people). Paul proclaimed the Gospel, established churches, and wrote to these new communities and their leaders to instruct, encourage, and correct them. As one set apart for the gospel of God, Paul writes to the Roman Christians in order to proclaim this good news, defend his apostolic authority, enlist the prayerful support of the Roman Christians, and express his eagerness to visit them. Paul—as apostle, teacher, and pastor—longs for the believers to be strengthened and mutually encouraged by the gospel. We approach Romans with the same hope.

TEACHING TIME

God's Impartial Judgement

FOCUS

God is fair and sees everything, so instead of judging others, we should listen to Him and do what is right.

WARM-UPS

- What kinds of sports do you know that need a referee, an umpire or a judge?
- Why do we need these people?

We want sport to be fair. And we'd like our world to be fair all the time. But it isn't. And part of that is because we are **all** unfair.

Think about the times when we are unfair to others.

- We expect we should be given first turn in a game.
- Or we exclude someone from our group because they're not 'like us'.
- Or we take the biggest slice of cake before anyone else gets a chance to choose.

Somehow we feel it's OK if **we** do those things, but it's not OK if someone else does them to **us**.

God understands this problem we have because he sees our heart. He knows that we are all sinners. And because of that...

...we judge other people when they do wrong things, but we don't notice when we do the same thing.

In his letter to the Romans, Paul tells us that when God judges people, he will judge everyone fairly. He doesn't compare us with each other. God doesn't say: *This person is doing wrong things but at least they're better than that person there.*

To God, we **all** have the same problem: sin. It is sin that makes us want our own way in our family or with our friends. And worse than that, it is sin that makes us want our own way with God. We know the way that he *wants* us to act, and talk and think - but too often we just do what we like.

Sin pulls us in the opposite direction of God's way. And we all deserve to be found 'guilty'. But the good news is that when Jesus died, he took the punishment for our sin - and opened the way to be right with God. If we trust him, he will not judge us for our sin. That's how much God loves us.

Being right with God means that we will try to please him, by choosing to obey - no matter what other people are doing. It's our way of thanking him.

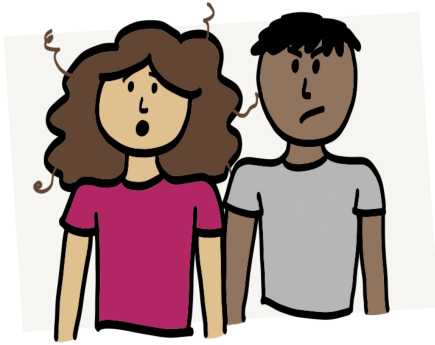

Be careful about judging other people. We often point out what others do wrong, but forget to think about ourselves.

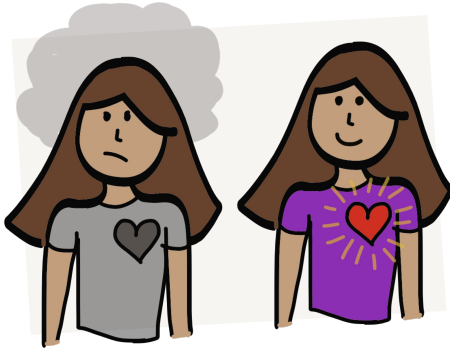


God is the perfect judge. He is always fair and always right.

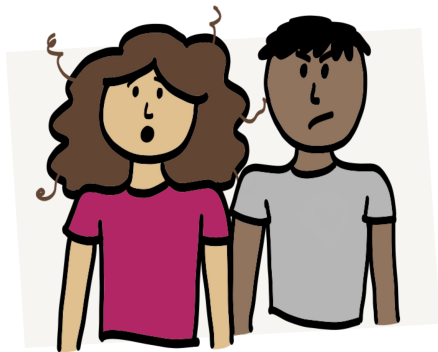

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS[View SBK ebook Romans 2:1-16](#)**1. Have you noticed anyone being really annoying this week?****Do you think that you have been annoying?**

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

Read Romans 2: 1-16 from SBK Middle Primary Scripture

- 1. Has anyone been unfair to you this week?** Maybe your parent didn't notice when you've done something really good.....Or a teacher blamed you for something when you weren't the only one... or a referee was biased. **How did you feel when you felt wrongly judged?**
- 2. Why is it wrong to judge (criticise) other people v1?** Because we don't notice when we do the same things ourselves.
Can you think of something unkind that you did this week - but you would criticise others for if they did it to you?
Talk about times when you have been greedy or unkind or selfish. For example, teasing someone - and then getting very cross if they tease you back.
- 3. How is God very different from us v2-4**
He is always fair, kind and patient.
- 4. What does God promise for all people who trust in Jesus?** They will live with him forever.
- 5. Why can we trust God to always make the right decision about people v5-11?**
Because he knows our hearts and is always fair. He loves everyone equally - it doesn't matter what we look like or how clever we are or who our friends are.
- 6. How is there a big difference between hearing (or knowing about) God's law and doing God's law?**
Explain that 'doing' God's law means to obey it. And we can 'hear' or 'know about' God's law, but it only makes a difference to our lives if we obey what it says.
Invite children to give examples eg you know that God's law is that we must tell the truth, but we lie because we don't want to get into trouble for what we have done.
- 7. What do you think it means that God's law is written deep inside us?**
We all know in our hearts, what is right and what is wrong. Even if no one had told us about the Ten Commandments, we would still know. So we are accountable to God for what we do.
- 8. Why is verse 16 such good news?**
No matter what we have done, if we trust in Jesus, our sins are forgiven. We won't be judged for them.

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

Read Romans 2: 1-16 from the NIRV Bible

- 1. What examples of unfairness have you seen this week?** Maybe your parent didn't notice when you've done something really good.....Or a teacher blamed you for something when you weren't the only one... or a referee was biased. **How did you feel when you felt wrongly judged?**
- 2. Why is it wrong to judge other people v1?**
Because we don't notice when we do the same things ourselves.
Can you think of something you did this week that you would judge (criticise) others for if they did it?
Talk about times when you have been greedy or unkind or selfish. For example, teasing someone - and then getting very cross if they tease you back.
- 3. How do you think that we disrespect God when we judge people v2-4?**
We are forgetting that we also sin - we expect God to be kind and patient with us but we are not kind and patient to others.
- 4. How do verses 5-11 show that God knows what our hearts are like?**
- he knows when we are not sorry for our sins
- he knows when we do good
- he knows when we won't accept the truth
- 5. Why is it good to know that God treats everyone the same v11?** He has no favourites. We can't impress him by how we look, how clever we are or who our friends are.

- 6. In v11-16, Paul talks about how the Jewish people were given the law - and the Gentiles (non-Jews) did not receive the law from God in the same way that the Jews did. Why is v15 so important?**

Because we all know in our hearts, what is right and what is wrong. Even if no one had told us about the Ten Commandments, we would still know.

- 7. Also in verse 11-16, Paul explains that there is a big difference between hearing (or knowing about) God's law and doing God's law. What do you think he meant?** Doing God's law means to obey it. Anyone can 'know about' God's law, but it only makes a difference to our lives if we obey what it says.
Invite children to give examples eg you know that God's law is that we must tell the truth, but we lie because we don't want to get into trouble for what we have done.

- 8. Why is verse 16 such good news?**
If we trust in Jesus, our sins are forgiven. God knows our hearts and we won't be judged for our sin because Jesus has taken the punishment instead of us.
- 9. How can we thank God for loving us even though we sin?** By choosing every day to obey him and show it by being kind and fair in the things that we do, the things that we say and by offering help to someone who needs it

Mirror Play

STEPS

1. Have the children play with the mirrors available.
2. Talk about who they can see in the mirror and how it is a reflection of themselves. God helps us see our own hearts not just other people's.

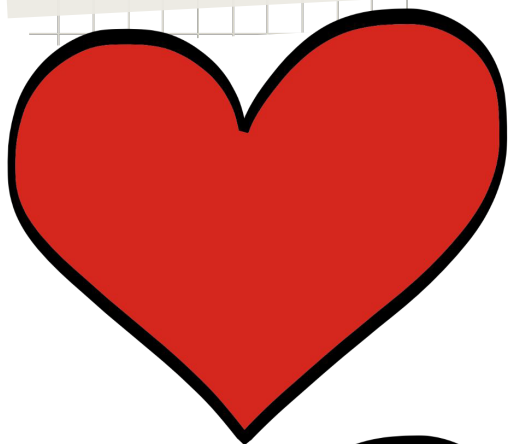
STEPS

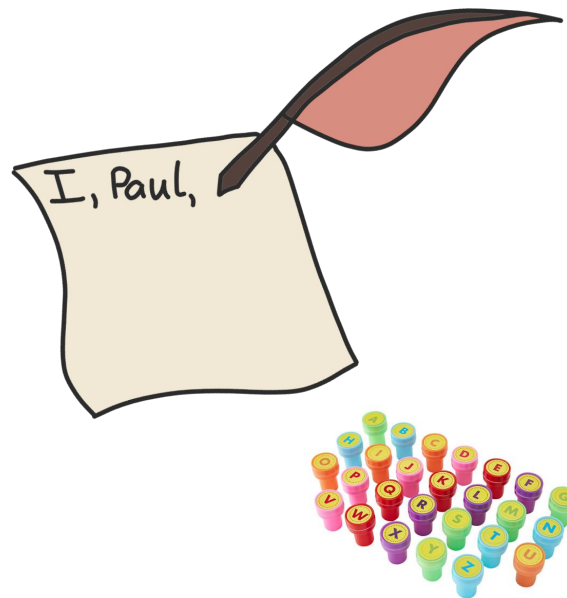

STEPS

1. Remind the children we are looking at a letter Paul wrote to the Romans. Talk about how Paul wrote letters to lots of groups, encouraging them to stay firm in their faith.
2. Give each child a printout and encourage them to use the alphabet stamps to stamp letters all over their page and use the stamps to help them write their name.



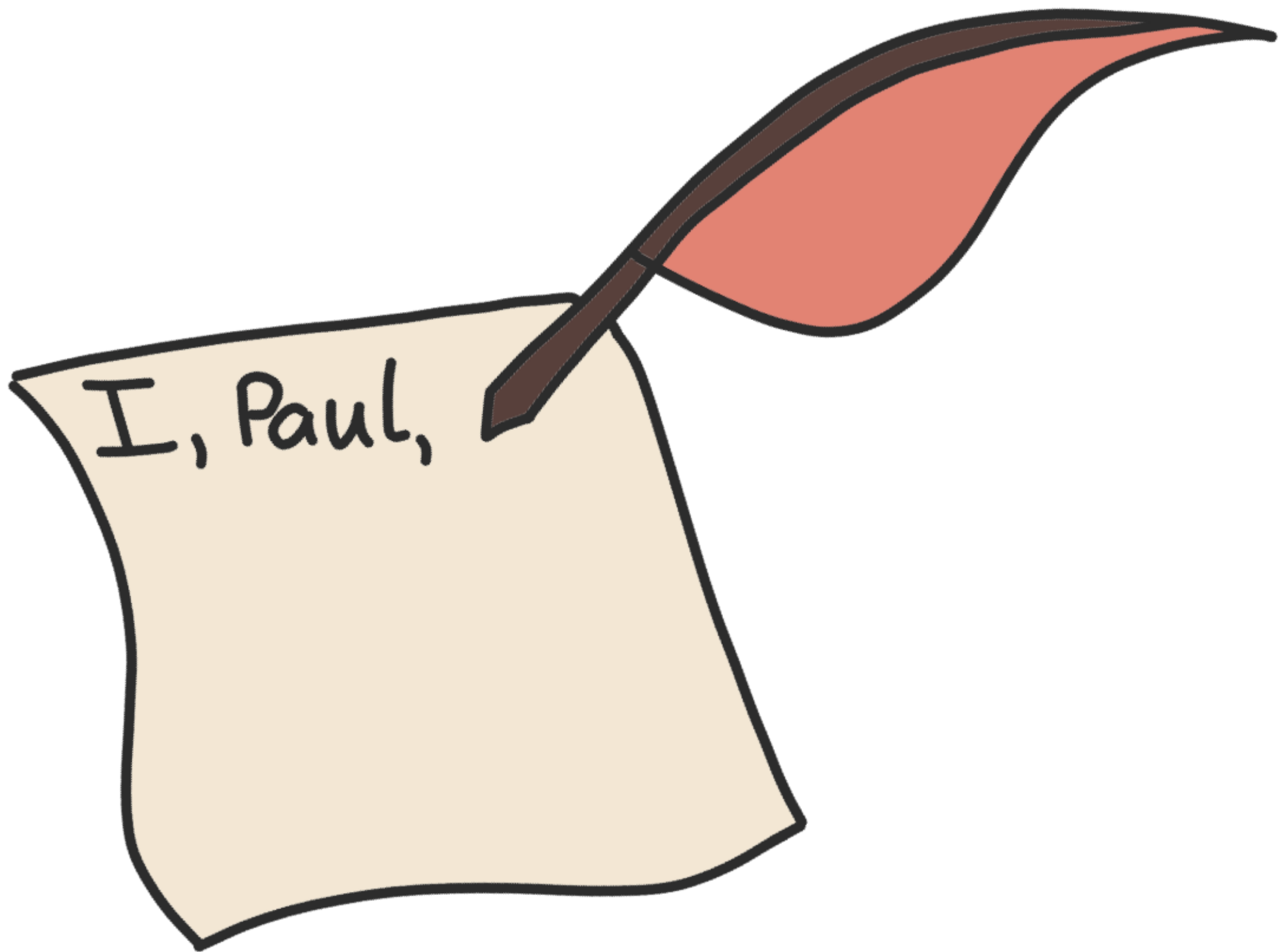

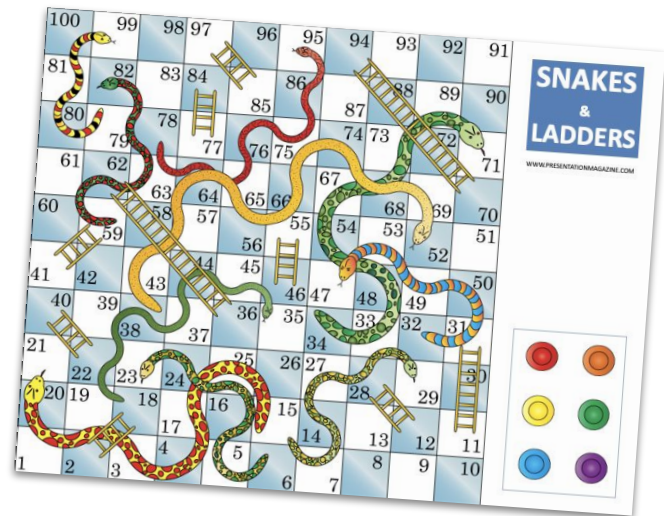

STEPS

1. All children place their counters on square 1.
2. The children take turns rolling the dice and moving that many squares forward.
3. If they land on a snake HEAD, they slide down the snake and land on the tail. If they land on the BOTTOM of a LADDER, they climb UP the ladder and land on the top square the ladder finishes.
4. Continue playing until one of the players reaches the '100' square.
5. Talk about how playing snakes and ladders takes patience and kindness because we have to wait our turn.

Magnifying Glass

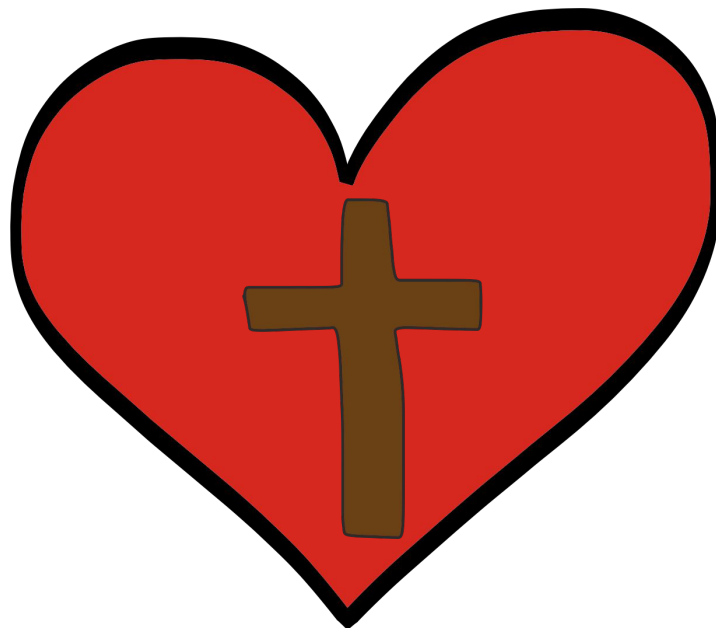
Clean Heart

YOU'LL NEED...

- Paper
- Coloured Pencil/Pens
- Cross Stickers
- Clipboards

STEPS

1. Get the kids to draw a large heart on their paper.
2. Inside the heart get the kids to write or draw wrong attitudes (judging, selfishness, anger, etc).
3. Then have the kids place a cross sticker on the heart, reminding us that even when we do the wrong thing God still loves us.

Jesus forgives us and cleans our hearts.

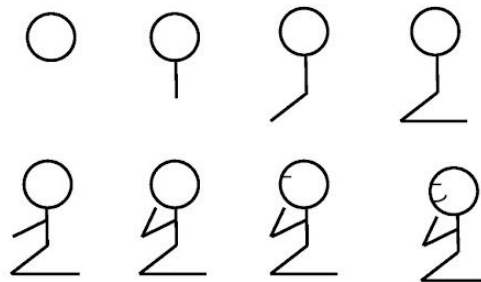
STEPS

1. As a whole group or break up into smaller groups (2-3 people) play a game of praying man (hangman).
2. Get one person to choose a word from the SBK Middle Primary Scripture.
3. Place one dash on the bottom of the whiteboard for each letter of the word or words chosen. Leave a space between words.
4. The others in the group take turns to try and guess ONE letter at a time.
5. If the letter is correct - fill in that letter on each dash it appears. If the letter is not used in that word, you need to add one body part of the drawing each time.
6. It is also useful to keep a list of the error letters down the side, so the children recall which letters have already been chosen.
7. Explain to the players that if the drawing of the person is completed before the word or words are guessed, the guessing players have lost the game. If however the team works out the word before the person has been drawn, they win.

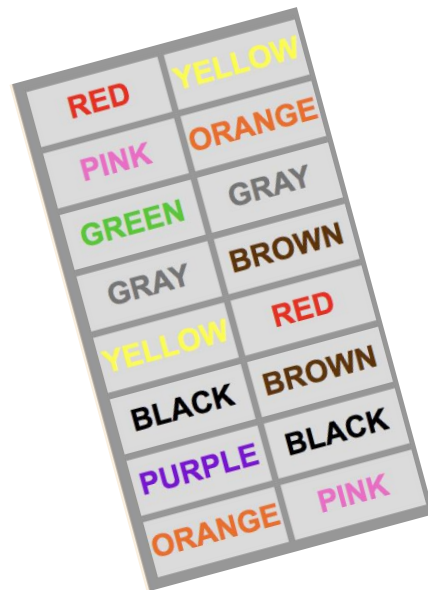
The Stroop Effect

YOU'LL NEED...

- Printout of Worksheet #3

STEPS

1. Ask one child to read through List 1, saying out loud the colour of the text (not what the word says). Ask someone different to read through List 2.
2. Give each child a turn to read through the lists.
3. Just like our brain struggles to ignore the wrong answer to say the right one - sometimes we also do things that don't match what we say. Paul tells us that God cares about how we act, and just knowing what the right thing is is not enough.

STEPS

1. Play a game where kids must carefully listen and follow instructions.
2. One of the team should be the leader for this game. After multiple rounds, assess whether some of the children might be confident enough to have a turn.
3. The leader issues instructions to the children and it's the children's job to follow each of them. Examples may include:
 - star jumps
 - sit down
 - run on the spot
 - pat head
 - click fingers
 - jump up and down
 - touch toes
 - turn around
 - stand up tall and reach up high
 - stand on tippy toes
 - hop on left foot
 - hop on right foot
 - clap X times
 - follow the leader without the leader saying anything

STEPS

1. One leader to be captain of the ship. The captain is in charge of the ship and yelling out orders to the crew.
2. Crew members must obey all of the captain's orders. If they do the wrong action or are too slow they are out.
3. Play continues with the captain calling and the crew responding. The faster the actions are called and performed, the trickier the game becomes.

Captain's orders:

Scrub the decks: crew members get on their hands and knees and pretend to scrub the deck.

Man overboard: crew members find a partner, hold hands and pretend to row a boat.

Climb the rigging: crew members pretend to climb a ladder.

Captain's coming: crew members salute and say "aye captain".

Hit the deck: crew members lay face down on the floor.

Four corners: there are four corners of the ship: back, front, left and right. When the captain yells out a corner all crew members must run to it.
