SERIES OVERVIEW

ROMANS - Strengthened by the Gospel

Paul's letter to the Romans is one of the most important pieces of written correspondence in all of human history. Formerly known as Saul of Tarsus, Paul—a Pharisee who actively persecuted Christians—had a radical encounter with the risen Lord Jesus and was commissioned by Jesus as an apostle to proclaim the Good News to the Gentiles (the world of non-Jewish people). Paul proclaimed the Gospel, established churches, and wrote to these new communities and their leaders to instruct, encourage, and correct them. As one set apart for the gospel of God, Paul writes to the Roman Christians in order to proclaim this good news, defend his apostolic authority, enlist the prayerful support of the Roman Christians, and express his eagerness to visit them. Paul—as apostle, teacher, and pastor—longs for the believers to be strengthened and mutually encouraged by the gospel. We approach Romans with the same hope.

TEACHING TIME

Faith not Works

Why is Paul writing this letter to the Romans? He's wanting them to know how people like us - who are separated from God by our sin - can be made right with God, and become part of God's family.

Paul reminds the Romans of the story of Abraham. What do we know about Abraham?

He was a very wealthy man. And a powerful man. And he was very obedient to God.

But Paul tells us that Abraham wasn't made right with God because he was rich, or powerful or clever - but ONLY because he believed God. And because Abraham had faith in God, God used him in very special ways.

Paul reminds the Romans that King David learned the same thing as Abraham. Being a king and winning wars didn't make him right with God. *Only* God could make David right with him - because only God could forgive sin.

We're the same! We might not be rich and powerful like Abraham, or a King like David.

But like them, nothing we can do will make us right with God.

We might be clever at all sorts of things; we might come to Kids Church every week; we might try to be very good. These are *good* things - but they don't solve the problem of our sin. Whatever we do, sin separates us from God.

We have to learn like Abraham and David, that only believing God can make us right with God - because only He can forgive sin.

And we know something that Abraham and David didn't know - it was Jesus' death that makes it possible for us to be forgiven. That was God's plan from the beginning.

God makes this big promise to all of us who trust in him: we are made right with him. We are part of his family forever. This is what 'grace' means: God gives us the best thing in the world - and we don't have to pay him for it in any way.. It's his gift to all who believe. But it cost God a lot - to give his only Son to die for us.

And that's why, if we are part of his family, we thank him every day by living in ways that make him pleased.

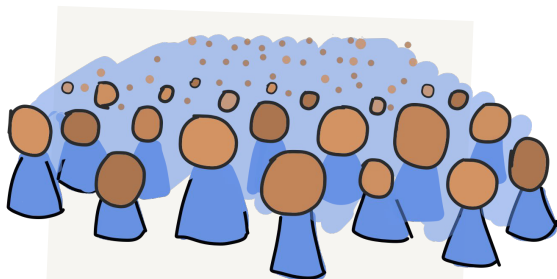


15-17 Everything depends on having faith in God, which is a gift of his undeserved grace. This promise isn't only for Abraham's family,

but also for us who trust in what Jesus has done for us. It is for all who have faith, just as he did. Abraham is the father of all who have such faith. That means us too.



18 God promised Abraham a lot of descendants. And when it all seemed hopeless, Abraham still had faith in God and became the father of many nations.



19 Abraham's faith never became weak, not even when he was nearly 100 years old. He knew he was almost dead and that his wife Sarah was past the normal age of having children.

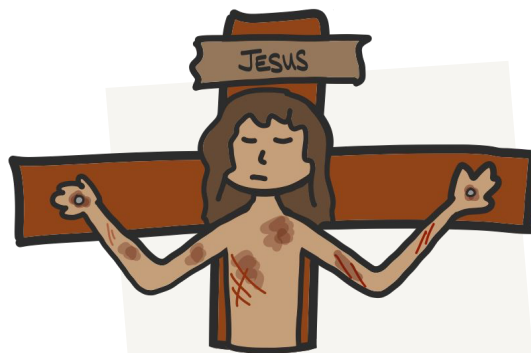

Read Romans 4 from SBK Middle Primary Scripture

- 1. Do you ever boast about the things you are good at? Why?** Talk about our desire to be accepted.
- 2. Do you think that you can impress God?** Talk about how God is not like people who are surprised or influenced by things that we do. He loves us and notices us - but also knows that we are sinners
- 3. Verses 1-3. What did Abraham do instead of boasting to God about how good he was?** He put his faith in God.
- 4. What does it mean that God gives us his acceptance?** It means that we can't do anything to earn it - God accepts us as a gift when we trust in him.
- 5. David was a famous king. What special blessing is given by God to those who know that they are sinners? v7-8** He forgives our sins even though we don't deserve it.
- 6. In v 13-14, God made promises to Abraham** (that he would be the father of a great nation, that the nation would have a land of their own, and that the nation would bless other nations.)
Why did God make these promises?
 - a. Because Abraham kept *all* the laws
 - b. Because Abraham tried his very best to keep all the laws
 - c. Because Abraham trusted God
 - d. Because Abraham convinced God he deserved it.
- 7. Read v 18-24. How many ways can you find that Abraham trusted God even when he was far too old to become a father?**
When it seemed impossible that he would ever become a father, Abraham still trusted God.
He never doubted that what God had promised would happen.
He gave God the credit when he became a father.
He believed totally that God's promise would be fulfilled.
In all this, God was always with Abraham
- 8. Go back to verses 15-17. Can you see how God makes promises to us too?** God promises to all who trust in him, that we will be accepted into his family.
The Holy Spirit is always with us when we trust in Him. - even if things sometimes go wrong. We can trust him every day.
- 9. Verse 25 explains how God can accept sinners who trust in Him. Can you put it in your own words?**
God gave his only Son Jesus, to die for our sins, so that we can be forgiven.
- 10. Why is it good news, that God has done everything we need for us to be part of his family?** It means God will not judge us for our sin - we can be part of his family.
- 11. Who will you share that Good News with this week?**

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

Read Romans 4 from the NIRV Bible

- 1. Do you ever boast about the things you are good at? Why?** Talk about our desire to be accepted.
- 2. Do you think that you can impress God?** Talk about how God is not like people who are surprised or influenced by things that we do. He loves us and notices us - but also knows that we are sinners
- 3. What happened when Abraham realised he couldn't brag about his achievements or his reputation to God?** He put his trust in God. Abraham was accepted by God (made right with God).
- 4. Why is it so important that God's gift of acceptance is completely free?** It means that we can't earn God's acceptance by our good works. It doesn't matter how we compare with other people.
- 5. How do you feel when you read King David's words in verses 7-8?** Thankful because our sins can be forgiven and God will not hold us accountable for them.
- 6. How can that be true for us if we have faith? v 23-25** Because Jesus died for our sins, and through his resurrection we are given new life and made right with God.
- 7. So how did people like Abraham and David become right with God when they died before Jesus came?** Because of *their* faith in God. Not because they were good people.
- 8. Read v 18-24. How many ways can you find that Abraham trusted God even when he was far too old to become a father?**
When it seemed impossible that he would ever become a father, Abraham still trusted God.
His faith grew as he waited.
He gave glory to God when he became a father.
He never gave up hope that God would keep his promise. He remained absolutely convinced of God's power.
In all this, God was always with Abraham
- 9. What are God's promises to us?** God promises that all who trust in him, will be accepted into his family. And He is always with us even when things are going wrong.
How does the story of Abraham's patience help us? We can trust God's promise to never leave us. The Holy Spirit lives in us.
- 10. Why is it good news, that God has done everything we need for us to be part of his family?** It means God will not judge us for our sin - we can be part of his family. This is why we say that we are saved 'by faith and not works'.
- 11. Who will you share that Good News with this week?**

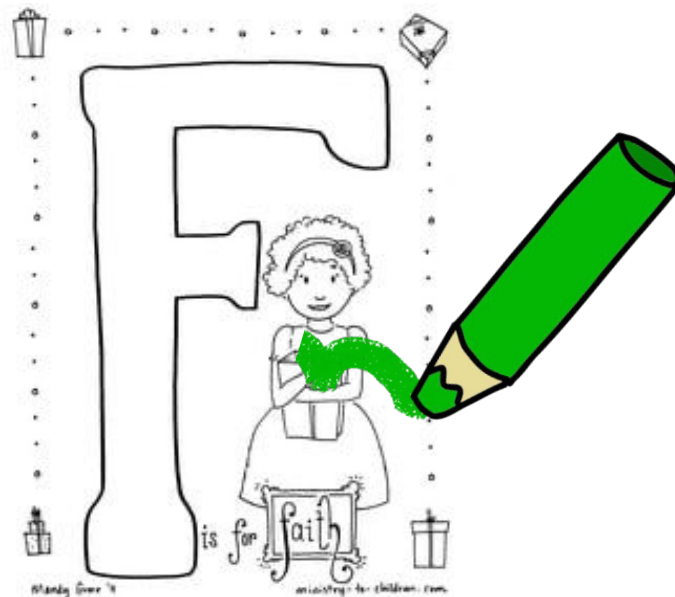

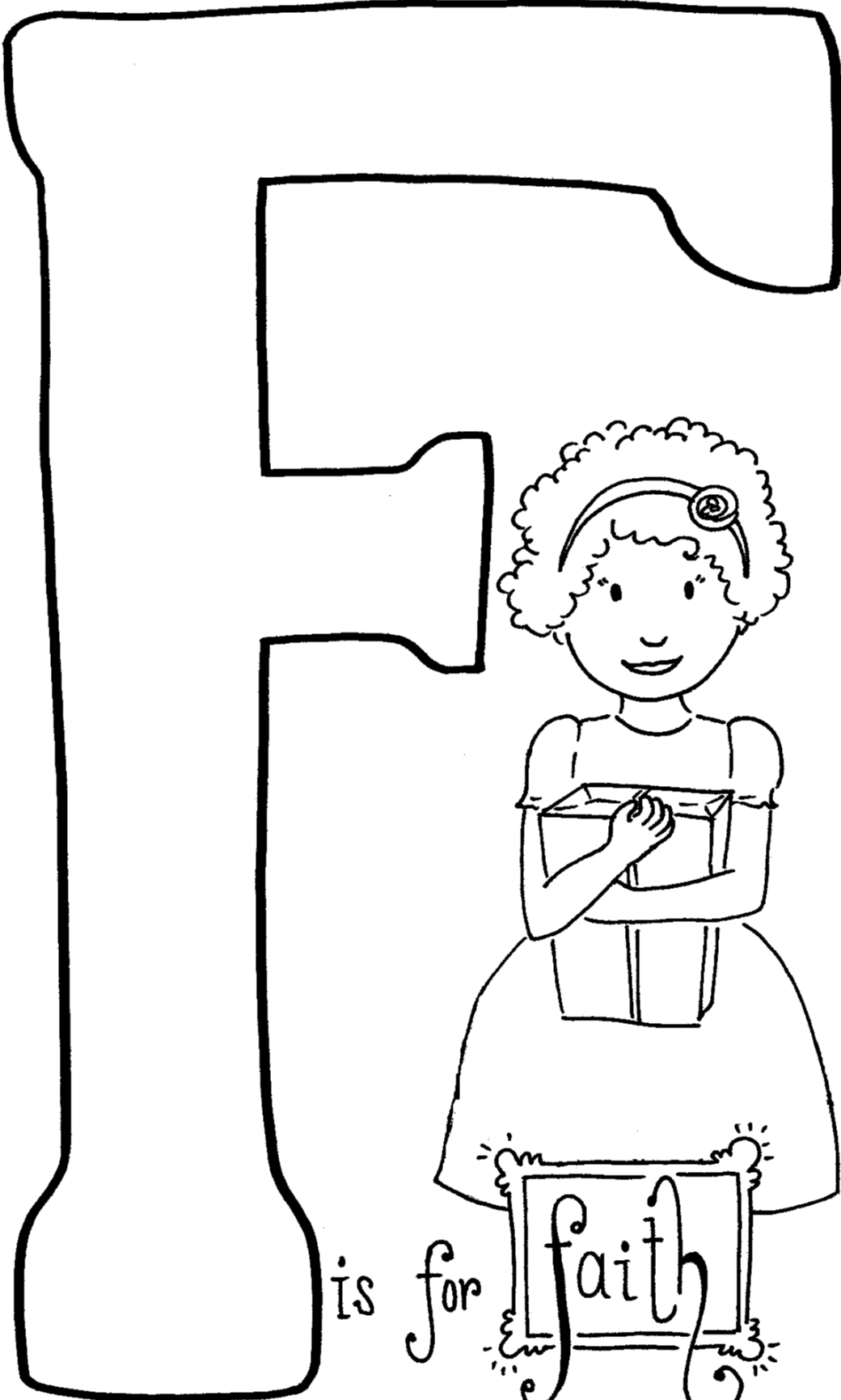

YOU'LL NEED...

- Baby Dolls
- Prams / High Chairs

STEPS

1. Bring out the baby dolls, prams, high chairs, dolls clothes, etc.
2. Talk about babies and who might have a baby brother or sister in their family. Talk about how to care for a baby.

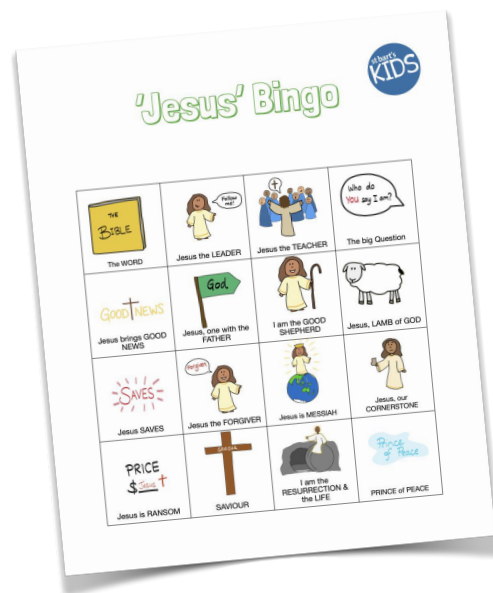
Jesus Bingo

YOU'LL NEED...

- Printout of Jesus Bingo game boards (1 of each)
- Printout of Bingo calling cards
- Markers (enough for 16 per player)

STEPS

1. Each player is to receive a different game board.
2. The caller selects one of the calling cards and reads out what picture is on the card.
3. All players who have that picture on their game board must place a counter where that picture is.
4. Continue calling out the cards until someone has 4 pictures/counters in a row (could be horizontal, vertical, or diagonal). Then they can call Bingo!

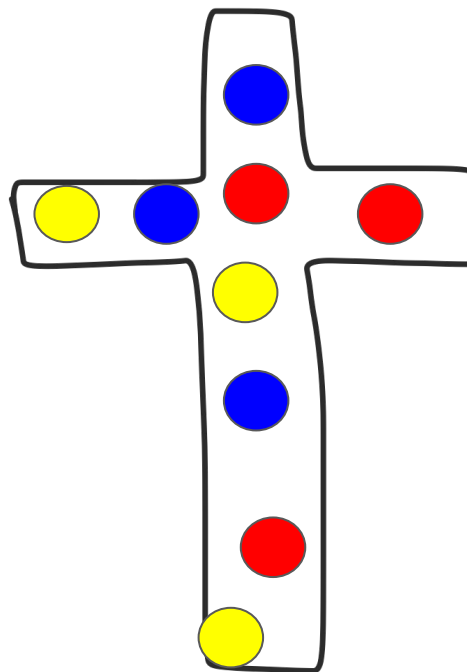
Dot the Cross

YOU'LL NEED...

- Dot Stickers
- Printout Worksheet #2

STEPS

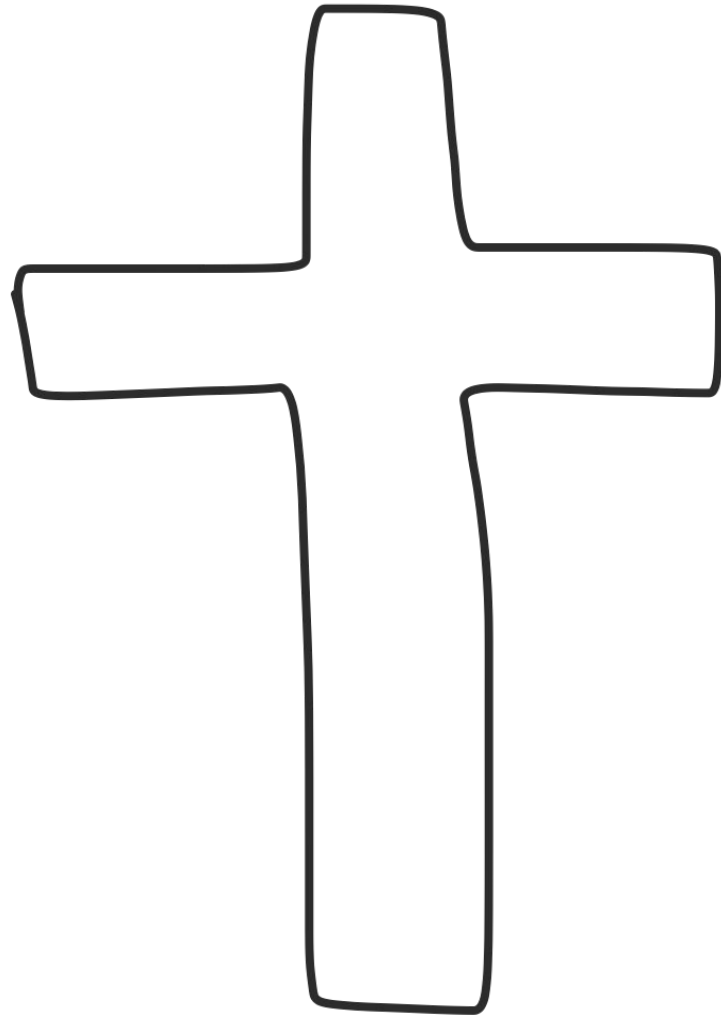
1. Give each child a cross printout sheet and some dot stickers.
2. Get the children to place the dot stickers on their cross.
3. Explain to the children that we don't belong to God by being good enough. We belong to God by trusting in Him. Jesus died on the cross for our sins and rose again, so we can be part of God's family.

Foam Mats

YOU'LL NEED...

- Foam Alphabet Mats

STEPS

1. Get out the foam mats and encourage the children to find letters they know or find letters from their name.
2. Take all the letters out of the squares and help the children match them back up.
3. Spell out other short words or ones that rhyme (cat, mat, hat, rat).
4. Lastly spell out JESUS and remind the kids - we don't get right with God by following rules. We are made right with God when we trust in Jesus. And when we do, Jesus lives in us and helps us live for him.

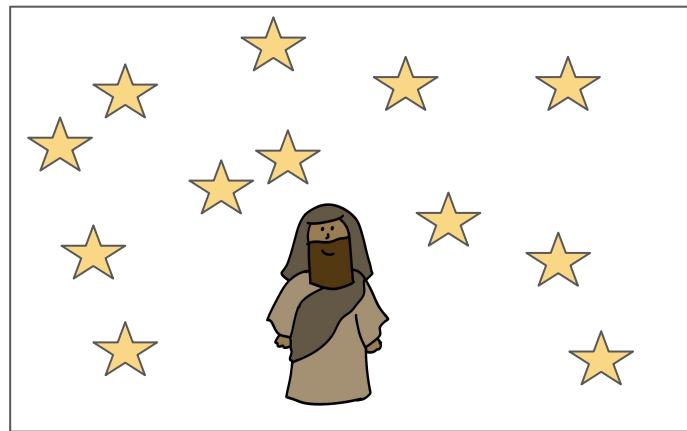
Abraham's Descendants

1. Set up the jenga blocks into a large stack.
2. Players take turns to try and remove ONE block (cannot be from the top layer). Once they take it out, they then place it on the top.
3. The tower continues to have pieces removed and placed on top until it collapses.
4. This tower is like our life if we try to be right with God by following rules and doing good things. Eventually, it collapses. We can only be right with God through Jesus.

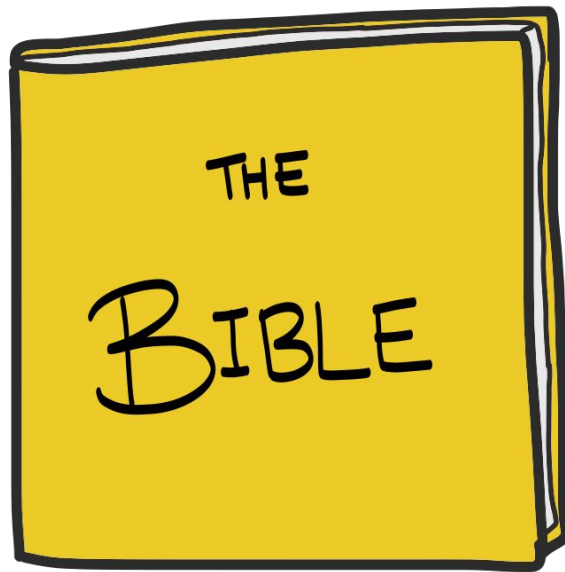
People Who Trusted God

YOU'LL NEED...

- Printout of Worksheet #3
- Bibles

STEPS

1. Split the kids into pairs and give each pair a question sheet and a Bible.
2. Have each pair look up a different Bible passage about someone who trusted God and answer the questions.
3. Share the answers with the group.
4. Ask, "What do all these people have in common?"
 - *They weren't perfect.
 - *Trusting God was sometimes scary.
 - *Faith meant relying on God's promises, not themselves.
 - *Just like Abraham, we belong to God through faith, trusting him, not by being good enough.

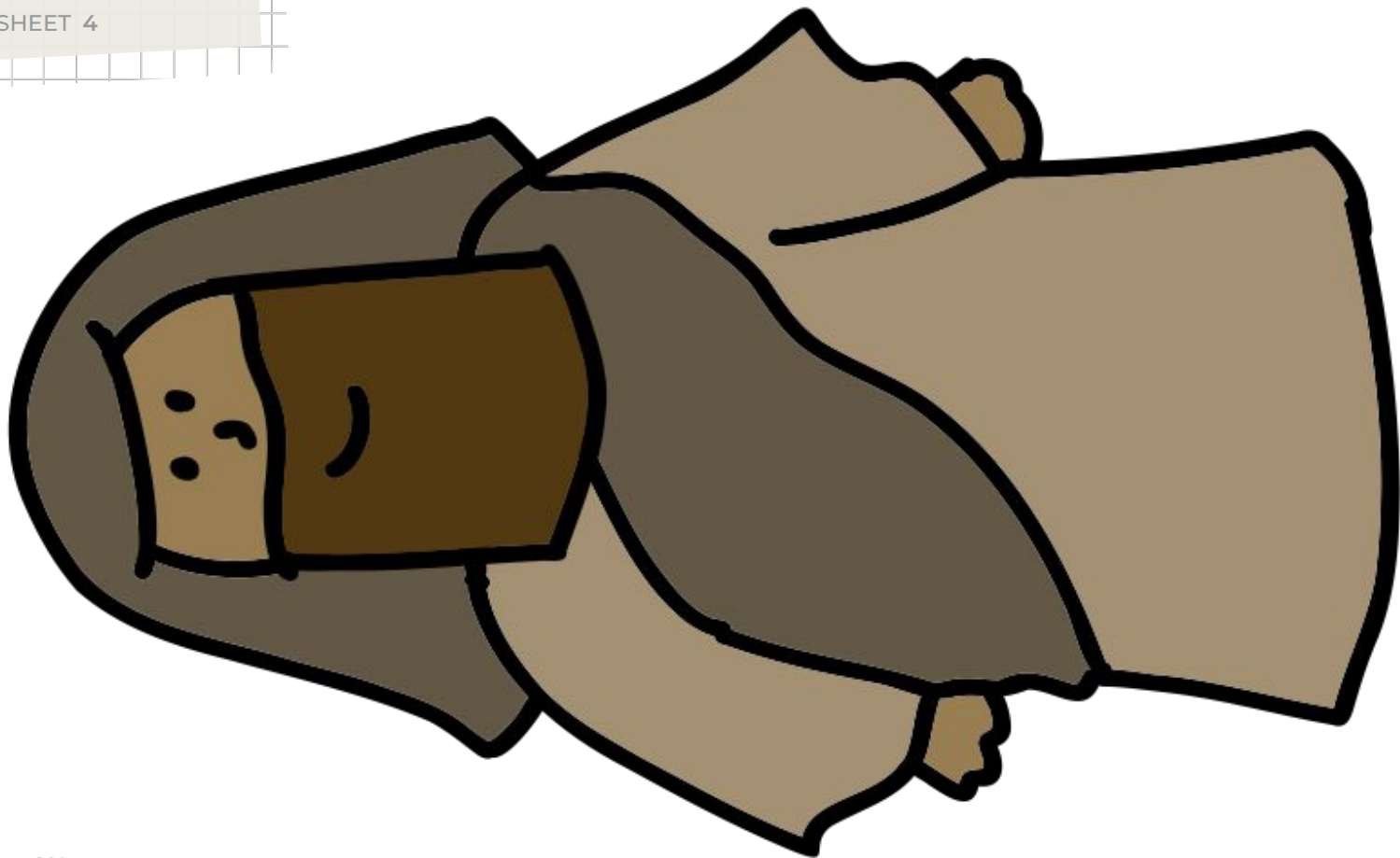

5. Repeat.

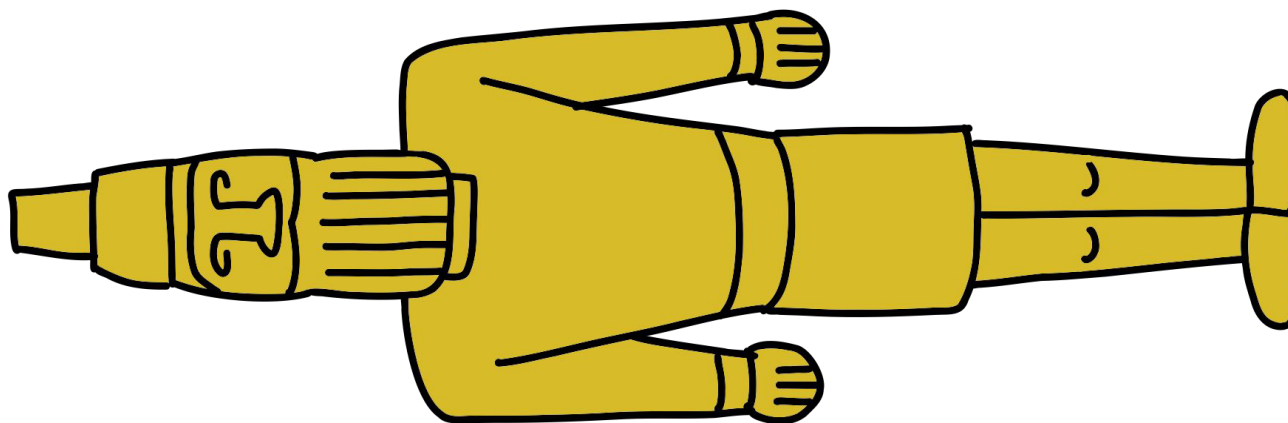

GAME: Freeze - Action - Freeze!

YOU'LL NEED...

- Music

STEPS

1. Start the music and encourage the children to move around the room
2. When the music is spontaneously paused, the children are to **FREEZE** exactly where they are.
3. The leader will then call out a word - either FAITH, HOPE or LOVE - the children are then to form a pair and create the **ACTION** with their hands.
4. Once they have formed the action, they are then to **FREEZE** again. Stay still!! Pairs that are too slow or wobble are out. Pairs that are out can then assist the leader spot others to also be out!
5. Repeat until there are just a few pairs remaining. For a challenge, call out an action - freeze - and then add a second (or third) action immediately.
