SERIES OVERVIEW

ROMANS - Strengthened by the Gospel

Paul's letter to the Romans is one of the most important pieces of written correspondence in all of human history. Formerly known as Saul of Tarsus, Paul—a Pharisee who actively persecuted Christians—had a radical encounter with the risen Lord Jesus and was commissioned by Jesus as an apostle to proclaim the Good News to the Gentiles (the world of non-Jewish people). Paul proclaimed the Gospel, established churches, and wrote to these new communities and their leaders to instruct, encourage, and correct them. As one set apart for the gospel of God, Paul writes to the Roman Christians in order to proclaim this good news, defend his apostolic authority, enlist the prayerful support of the Roman Christians, and express his eagerness to visit them. Paul—as apostle, teacher, and pastor—longs for the believers to be strengthened and mutually encouraged by the gospel. We approach Romans with the same hope.

WARM-UPS

- Can you remember a time when you experienced something really, really uncomfortable and you just couldn't wait for it to STOP! Perhaps a visit to the dentist? Maybe you had to wear new shoes to school and you got a blister (and you couldn't wait until you got home to take them off)?

TEACHING TIME

Good News of Future Glory

Paul's message to us today is about things we find uncomfortable that are definitely NOT going to last forever! Everything that is wrong with our world today, everything that causes us concern, will one day come to an end. This is good news!

When sin entered the world many things went wrong. All of God's good creation (including land/sea, animals, plants and people etc) suffered through sickness and evil. The bible tells us the whole earth 'groans'. When someone you love gets sick, you see an injured animal, or hear of earthquakes, you know the earth is 'groaning'. This is not how God intended things to be!

BUT, as Christians, we have HOPE. God has promised that one day we will have new bodies that won't get sick and we will live on a new earth that will never experience decay. There will be no more sin and no more suffering.

So, how should we wait for God to make things new? The bible tells us not to be impatient. We need to place our trust and confidence in His goodness, wisdom and timing. We need to reassure others that this world is not all there is - the best is yet to come! Future glory with Christ our King.

We are not left to wait alone either. God has given us His Spirit to help us. Through prayer, we can bring our concerns to Him (the Spirit will even pray for us if we don't know what to say). Through reading the bible, the Spirit reminds of what is true and God's good plan. God's got this!

Does God help us just enough to get by? NO! The Bible tells us He makes us 'more than conquerors'. This means he gives us everything we need to get through the struggles and trials we face. We can be totally secure of God's presence with us - now and for all eternity! Hard times are temporary!

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

View SBK ebook Romans 8:18-39

Nothing can separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus our Lord. Romans 8:38-39

- 1. Have you ever made a promise?**
Encourage children to talk about a promise they have made. "I promised to make my bed in the morning". "I promised to feed our puppy every day".
- 2. Promises are important. If a promise gets broken, how does it make you feel?**
Promises mean you can expect something to happen either now or in the future. Broken promises can make us very sad.
- 3. The Bible tells us (who) keeps His promises?**
God always keeps His promises. God is good and cannot lie. We can always trust God to do what He promises to do..
- 4. Can you name some of God's promises?**
God promises to love us.
God promises never to leave us.
God promises to forgive us when we do wrong things.
God promises to give us what we need.
God promises to make all things new!

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

Read Romans 8:18-39 from SBK Lower Primary Scripture

1. Can you name some things that seem 'topsy turvy' about our world?

Invite children to briefly discuss things that make the world seem 'upside down'. People getting sick, animals getting sick, rubbish being left on the ground, people hurting each other, etc.

2. As Christians, we have hope in the promises of God and God has promised to make all things new. What might this look like?

Nobody getting sick. No animals being harmed. No rubbish being left on the ground. Everyone treating each other nicely. No bad words etc.

3. How should we wait for God to fulfil His promise?

- demand that God end all suffering right now
- give up and complain that God doesn't love us
- stomp our feet loudly
- trust in God and wait patiently

4. What might it look like for us to wait for hard times to end?

We can pray and ask God to help us. We can thank God that He always keeps His promises. We can trust that hard times will not last forever.

5. When God makes all things new, what will it look like?

The Bible tells us it will be glorious. We will be with Jesus and everything will be as it should be. Remember how beautiful the garden of Eden was? Our eternal future with God will be like that - it will be perfect.

6. Is there anything that could separate us from God's love?

NO! The bible tells us (vs 38-39) that nothing can take us away from God's love. He sent Jesus to prove how much he loved us. We are totally safe and secure - even when hard things happen.

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

Read Romans 8:18-39 from SBK Middle Primary Scripture

- 1. Can you name some things that have gone wrong in our world?**
Discuss how everything God made was good - but when sin entered the world, so did suffering and evil. This has affected every living thing. People get sick, animals suffer and plants get diseases. This is not how God intended His creation to be.
- 2. When we become Christians, God gives us His Spirit which makes us long for something new. What is it?**
We long for suffering to end. We know that God has promised to give us new bodies and create a new earth. We look forward to this future with great hope!
- 3. Hard things do and will happen to us. Is there anything happening in the world right now that worries you or you long to see an end to?**
Tread carefully and open the discussion up to hear of what current news events or personal events may be causing concern in the lives of those in your group. *E.g. Bird Flu? Hurricanes? People at war? Sick ones?*

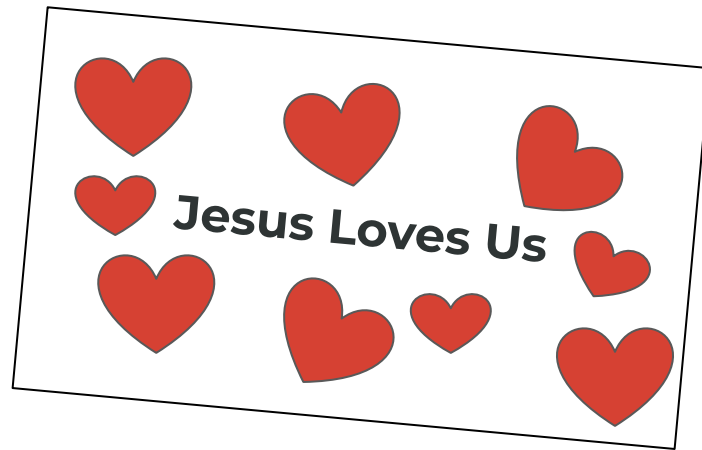
Jesus Loves Us Collage

Building Blocks

YOU'LL NEED...

- Building Blocks - Wooden Blocks, Mega Blocks, Q-Blocks, Lego or Duplo

STEPS

1. Get the children to play with the building blocks.
2. Help them make different creations.
3. For the kindy kids see if they can make a cross with the blocks and talk about what Jesus did for us on the cross.

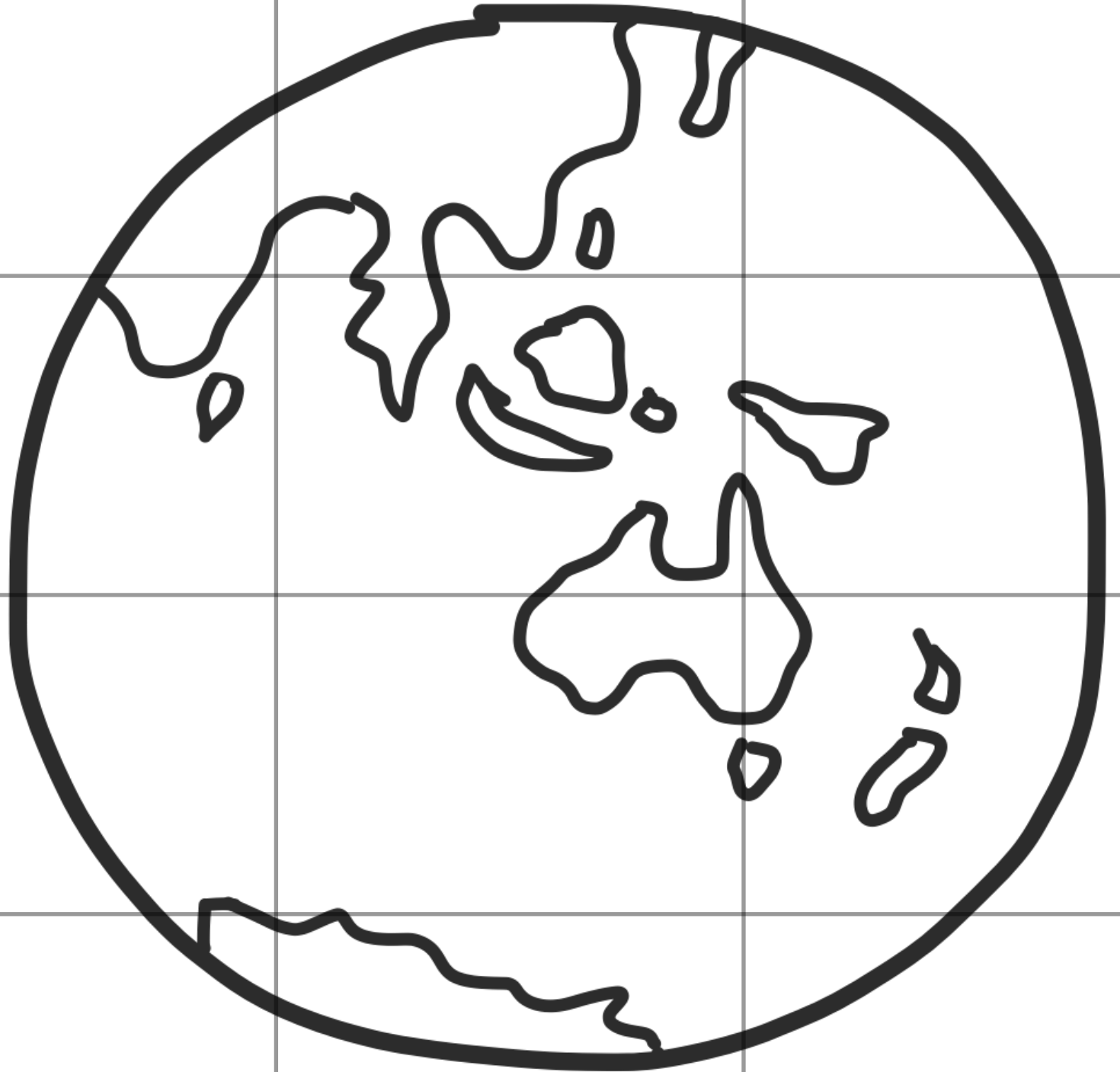

Heart Play Dough

YOU'LL NEED...

- Heart Cookie Cutter Set
- Play Dough

STEPS

1. Have play dough available for the group (either one colour or multiple colours).
2. Invite the children to roll out the dough and then use the cookie cutters to create hearts.

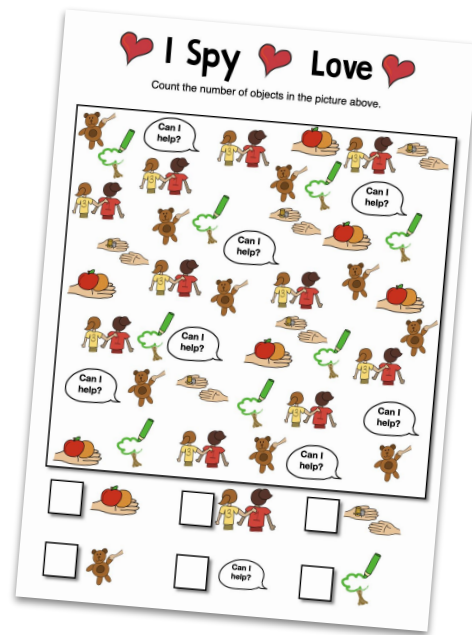

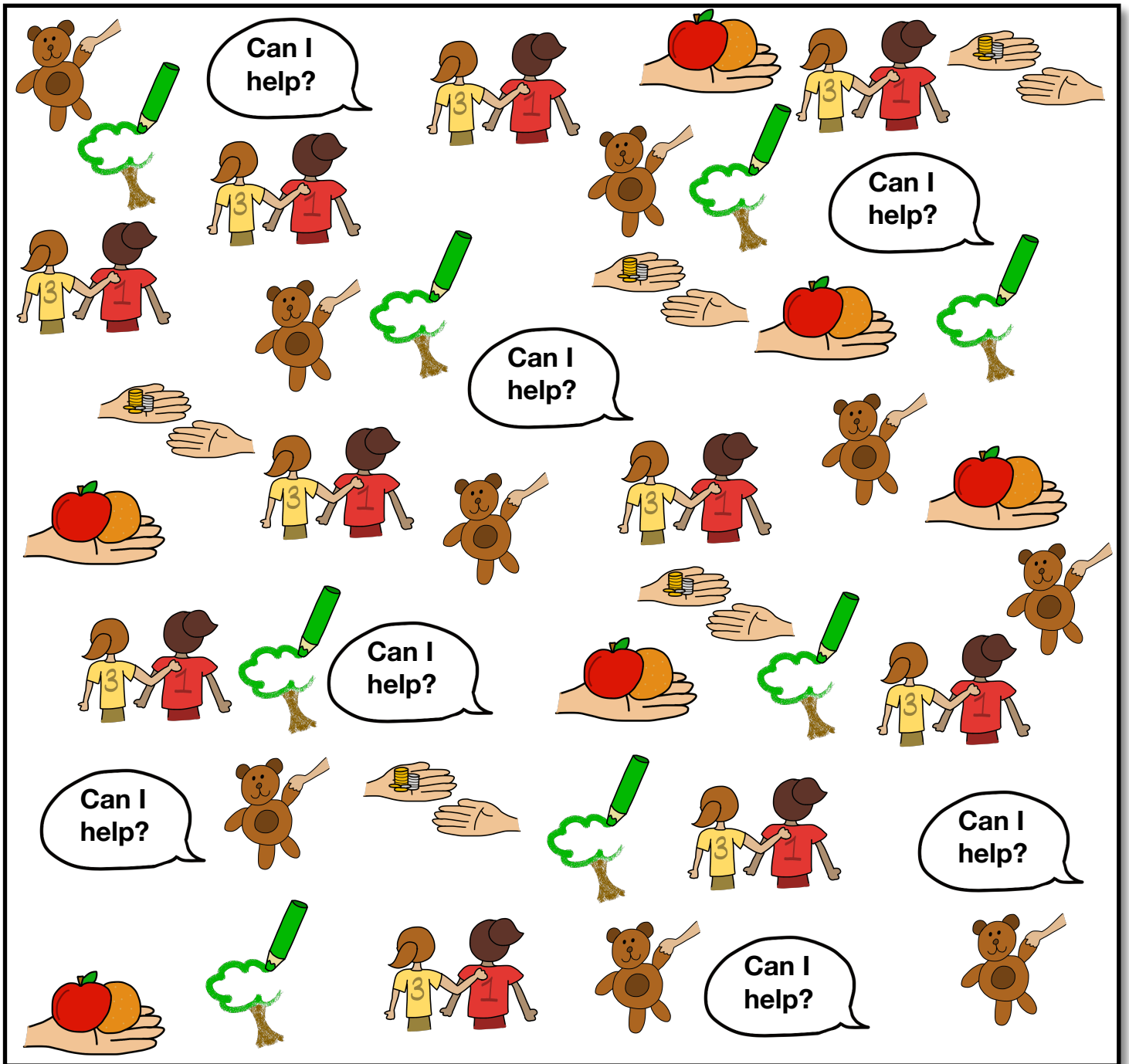

Block Cross

YOU'LL NEED...

- Duplo, Lego, or other connectable blocks

STEPS

1. Have each child build a cross out of lego.
2. Discuss the link - how nothing can stand in the way of God's love for us.

Danish Heart Basket

YOU'LL NEED...

- Printout of Romans 8:38-39 picture heart basket template (Worksheet #3)
- Scissors
- Stapler or sticky tape

It is recommended to watch a short video on how to assemble this basket and to practise this task so that you are comfortable in guiding children through the activity.

Here is a [step by step guide](#) or a [video](#) to help.

STEPS

1. Context: Danish heart baskets are a Scandinavian Christmas ornament made by weaving two pieces of paper or felt together to form an interlocking love heart shaped basket. They are traditionally hung on Christmas trees and filled with small gifts, candy, or notes.
2. Each child is to receive a printed template. **For this particular template, it is best to print the PDF at 95% to ensure none of the sections are cut-off.**
3. Cut around the black arches (2) and then fold each of the arches in half (see picture #2 opposite). Now cut up the dotted lines, ensuring you cut through both layers.
4. The unique weaving technique weaves both sides of the basket separately, but at the same time. To do this you take both pieces of paper (folded) and rotate at 45 degrees in opposite directions. Taking the two top strips, weave the first strip of the right arch between the first two layers of the left arch. Thread the next strip AROUND the second strip of the left arch. And then finally weave it BETWEEN the final strip of the left arch.
5. Repeat the process of the second and third strips of the right arch, alternating the weaving pattern until all of the strips are woven together.
6. Be sure to always weave one side between the two layers of the other side, so that you are left with a heart that opens into a basket at the end.
7. Using an offcut, cut a strip to use as a handle for the basket. Attach with either sticky tape or staples.



Link

Romans 8:38-39 explains clearly that God's love is stronger than anything - NOTHING can separate us. The images used in the template refer back to this verse and the interwoven heart once assembled, cannot be separated.

- Pencils

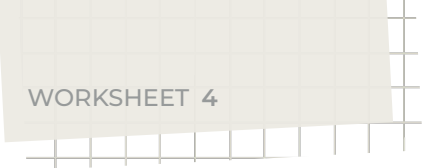
STEPS

1. Provide each child with a copy of worksheet #2 and a pencil.
2. Open up Romans 8:38-39 and read this together again.
3. Go through the list of things that Paul describes as things that could be seen to separate us from God (i.e., death, demons, powers). List these down the against side of the page.
4. Now reflect on specific everyday things that turn us away from God or at times seem too powerful for us to witness or recognise God's love (e.g., war, hate, money, control, lying...). List these also in the spaces provided on the left.
5. At the end, reflect how God's love is bigger than **all** of those things together!

This activity encourages children to reflect not only the words provided in Romans 8:38-39 but also to visualise that despite all the bad things around us, God's love is greater.

GAME: Love, Love, Jesus

YOU'LL NEED...

- N/A

STEPS

1. This game is a variation on 'Duck, Duck, Goose'.
2. Arrange the children sitting in a circle.
3. One child may volunteer to be 'it' first. The child will go around the circle tapping each child on the head in turn "love, love, love ..."
4. At random, the child will then tap another child and say "JESUS". The child sitting will stand up and chase the other child around the circle.
5. The child who was 'it' sits in the spot that was just vacated by the other child, and that child is now 'it'.
6. Continue until all children have had a turn to be 'it', or until time elapses.

GAME: Rob the Nest

YOU'LL NEED...

- Memory Verse (from Worksheet #5) printed in 4 different colours and cut out
- Hula Hoops x 4
- Bucket/container x 1

STEPS

1. Split everyone into 4 even groups. Each group is allocated a different colour.
2. In the centre of the room are pieces of the memory verse, pre-written on cardboard (one word per card). They are to be placed face-down on the floor. (Romans 8:38-39).
3. Each group sends one runner at a time to collect the TOP card from the centre pile and return to their group.
4. If the word on the card is written in their group colour, they keep the card behind their 'nest'. If it is not their colour, they place it face down in the nest.
5. Continue steps 3-4 until all the cards in the centre have been taken. Then teams are allowed to steal from other nests (still only ONE runner per team at a time).
6. Meanwhile the rest of the group works to put together all the words to form today's Scripture verse.
7. The first group to form the verse accurately is the winning team.
